	<ul> <li>Trevor presented aerial drone video footage of the full project alignment and talked through key construction progress         <ul> <li>Key notes include:</li> <li>Some sections of the walking and cycling path are still missing</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Some sections of the walking and cycling path are still missing but nearly all the landscaping is finished</li> <li>There is a lawn mower working along the route tidying up the vegetation, and the grass and trees are growing well</li> <li>Some noise walls are yet to be installed but will be completed in the coming weeks</li> <li>Most of the line marking is done apart from some off ramp</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>areas and south of Governor Road</li> <li>Some areas of the shared walking and cycling path are currently holding water but will be fixed before the project is completed and the Freeway opens. After opening, the project is required to come back and fix anything needing more work</li> <li>The north bound on-ramp near Lower Dandenong Road will be the last section completed before the Freeway opens</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>closures for the installation of barriers, as well as bridge painting and drainage, course wearing, detector loops and line marking before the end of October</li> <li>The southbound carriageway on the Mornington Peninsula Freeway will be closed for about three days in early-November for asphalting and line marking</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Key points:</li> <li>Hayden Dewar has identified an Aboriginal artist to collaborate with, and the two are working on the final design for the mural</li> <li>The design will be finalised shortly and Hayden will begin painting the mural in early-November</li> <li>A recent design of the mural was shared with the CRG group</li> <li>Community members will be able to access the pedestrian underpass while the artwork is going up, so they will be able to watch it progress</li> <li>Discussion:</li> <li>Adrian thanked the group for their role in the inception and creation of the mural</li> </ul>	
5	<ul> <li>End of works community event</li> <li>Key points: <ul> <li>Due to current COVID-19 restrictions at the time of the meeting, MRPV might not be able to hold an end of works community event</li> <li>Other opportunities for a celebration will be scoped pending Government health advice and any further announcements on restrictions</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Luke Minton
6	<ul> <li>CRG site visit</li> <li>Key Points: <ul> <li>Due to local health advice in line with COVID-19 restrictions, MRPV is looking into a possible visit before the Freeway opens</li> <li>Luke added that CRG members may be involved in a small media event and be among the first to drive on the new road as a thanks for their participation in the CRG</li> <li>Sam added that a walk on the freeway won't be possible with the lead time required and the restrictions that need to be overcome. Sam reiterated the desire to thank the CRG members in some way for their time</li> <li>Luke confirmed that with restrictions easing in November to allow groups of 15, a small site walk may be possible to inspect noise walls and an on-ramp. This will provide CRG members with an opportunity to ask additional questions about the project and chat to the project team</li> <li>Adrian asked CRG members what they think of this idea <ul> <li>A community member asked about the date and time for this event</li> <li>Luke responded that maybe 13 November as a tentative date, pending weather and site logistics. 	complete, and while they are ahead of schedule, they can't confirm a date for completion or opening at this stage. Sam also added that the CRG will be part of the first people to hear about completion and opening, and that it is likely to be weeks away, not months	
	A community member asked whether all works need to be complete before	
8	<ul> <li>opening         <ul> <li>Adrian confirmed that all works to ensure the safe operation of the freeway will be complete before opening, but there will be ongoing activity after opening to tidy up minor items along the route</li> </ul> </li> <li>A community member asked about the possibility of setting up a review of the project in a year's time to measure and evaluate the performance of the freeway and learn from the experience. They also suggested including traffic counts to track traffic volume and movement and involving VicRoads to do this. They added that this idea is supported by the Aspendale Gardens Residents' Association</li> </ul>	Emma Wiggan
