Craigieburn Road temporary closure

We're upgrading Craigieburn Road between Mickleham Road and the Hume Highway to help you get home sooner and safer.

Upcoming works

During the September school holidays we'll be working around the clock, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to relocate and install major utilities on Craigieburn Road between Hanson Road and Aitken Boulevard. We'll complete months of disruptive works in 12 days while sections of the road are closed.

To complete this work Craigieburn Road will be closed between:

- Hanson and Bridgewater roads from **8pm Friday 16 September to 5am Friday 23 September** (stage one)
- Bridgewater Road and Aitken Boulevard from **8pm Monday 26 September to 5am Monday 3 October** (stage two)
- During stage one, Healey Street and Belsay Place at Craigieburn Road will also be closed in both directions.

Craigieburn Road will be open over the Grand Final long weekend.

We'll have speed reduction and traffic management in place 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, with signed detours available (see maps overleaf).

What we're doing

We'll work closely with residents, businesses and drivers to undertake these works safely and efficiently.

- remove the existing pavement
- use excavators and rock breakers to dig a trench to expose the utility
- install new drainage and utility services
- once utility work is complete, fill the open trench, compact and reinstate the road surface
- We'll work closely with residents, businesses and drivers to undertake these works safely and efficiently.

What to expect

During major construction you may experience the following:

- lengthy disruptions, detours and significant delays when travelling through the area
- noise from equipment and machinery such as generators, concrete trucks, excavators and trucks
- vibration, dust and light from the work area
- additional travel times of up to 20 minutes in the morning and afternoon peaks.

Managing impacts

We'll monitor noise, vibration and dust levels at all times to ensure these impacts are kept to a minimum. If you have any concerns regarding noise or find the works highly disruptive, we invite you to contact us on 1800 105 105 to discuss.

The timeframe for these works may change as some activities are weather dependant. We'll keep you updated as works progress.

For your safety, please observe signs and instructions from traffic controllers. We ask that you plan your journey and allow extra time to travel through the area.

Pedestrian and cyclist impacts

There will be a number of pedestrian and cyclist detours associated with the works. These detours will be clearly sign posted.

Public transport impacts

Buses will be detouring around Craigieburn Road for the duration of the closure.

Detours will be in place along all routes affected, which will impact travel times. Bus routes impacted by the closure are: 525, 528, 529, 532, 533, 537, 541, 544, 390, 953 (night bus).

Detour information will be available on our website and at bus stops in the weeks prior to the road closure.

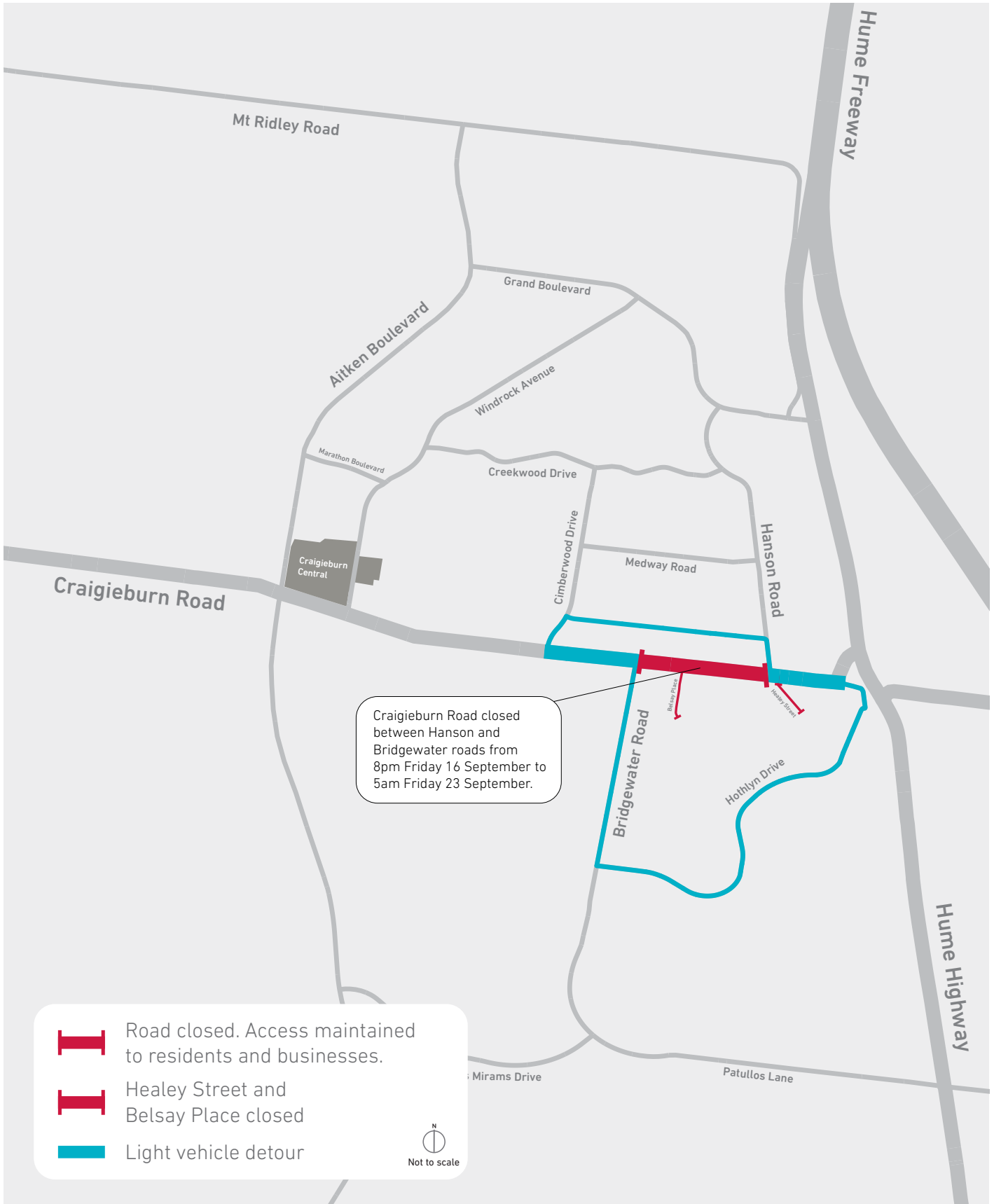

From 8pm Friday 16 September to 5am Friday 23 September (stage 1)

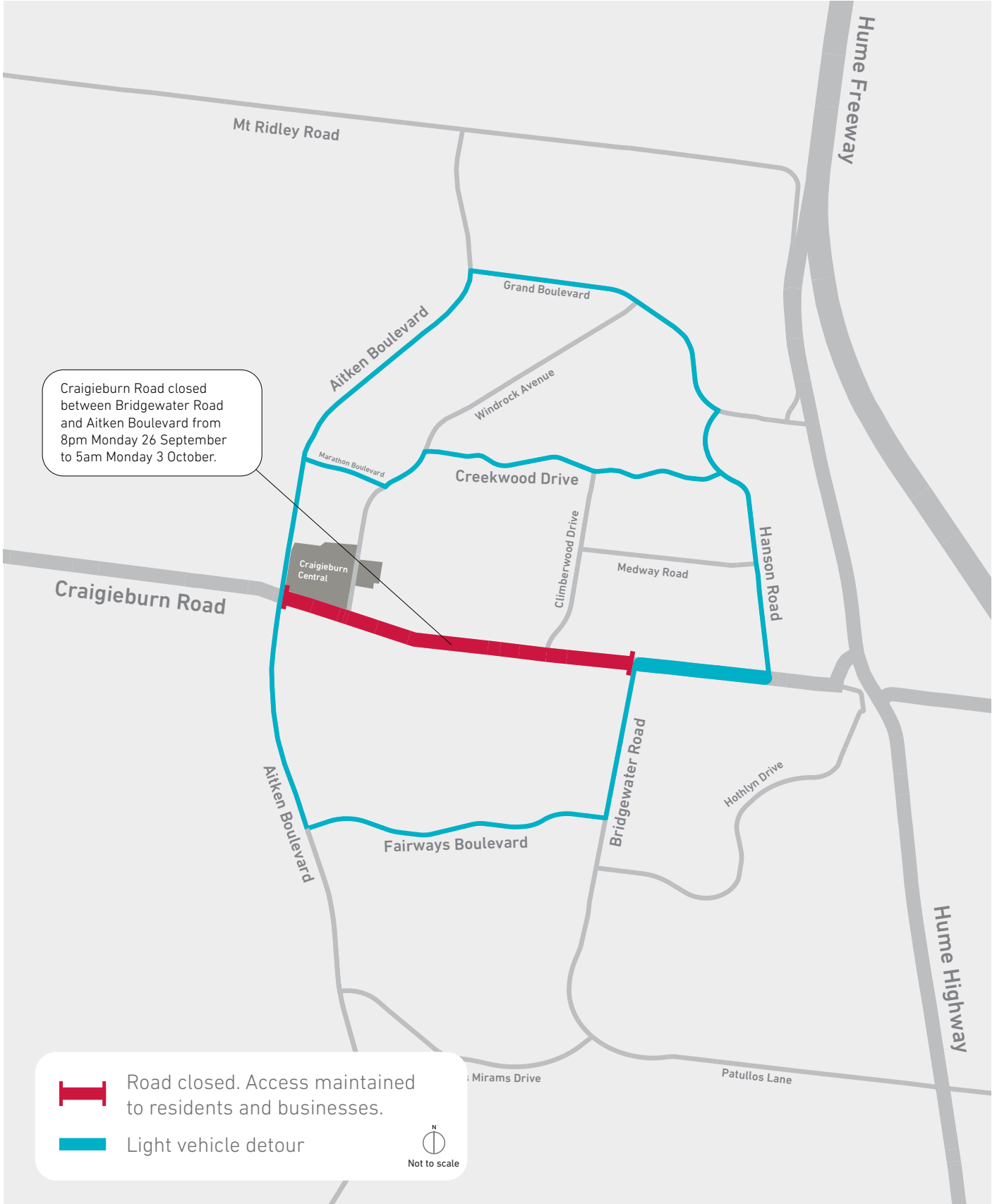
Light vehicle detour
