



Kangaroo grass

A sprawl of native grasses will be planted along the southern side of the rail trench, including kangaroo grass and grey tussock grass, which provide an important habitat and food source for small birds, animals and insects.




Purple coral pea

Native planting including Australian indigo, wattle mat rush and purple coral pea, will flourish along the new connection to the Heathmont Rail Trail, providing excellent groundcover and flowering at different times throughout the year.







Golden bush pea

A mix of native trees and plants that are tolerant to drought and feature attractive foliage will sit along the new pedestrian and cycling connection, including the Golden bush pea, dwarf lemon scented gum and long-flowered marlock.
