

Item	 Welcome and introductions NJ welcomed attendees and opened the meeting with an Acknowledgement of Country. NJ provided attendees with the opportunity to introduce themselves. NJ provided an overview of the agenda. NJ recapped previous actions.

Presentations from SRLA, LOR and SC LOR referred to the slides to provide an update on current and upcoming works in Monash, and community engagement and trader support initiatives throughout Notting Hill and Clayton. SC provided an update: Ongoing site investigations in the Monash area A presentation on the climate resilience risk assessment process. SRLA provided an update on structure planning engagement: A summary of feedback collected during the Key Directions for the Monash Precinct Feedback from previous stages of structure planning is currently being collated. Discussion: Anna Phillips (AP) suggested to engage with the Bicycle Network regarding detour signage for cyclists around Clayton as the data they record may be of use. Action: LOR to pass feedback regarding detour signage and Bicycle Network on internally. AP asked how the predicted increase in flood modelling would apply to outlying weather events with greater impacts. SC explained the modelling informs the coping range of an asset. When impacts are outside the coping range the asset becomes vulnerable and operators must make changes to protect it. AP noted more physical collateral, including translations, would be beneficial for the Notting Hill area, noting anecdotally the local community seems to engage less with online content.
