63,000 vehicles use these crossings each week day



Boom gates down for more than **30 minutes** of the morning peak



170 Metro and V/Line trains pass through the level crossings daily



**90,000 passengers** use the Cranbourne– Pakenham line each day

#### Road

- Main Street level crossing closed,
  Wednesday 27 July from 7pm to 10pm
- Racecourse Road closed between Henry Street and Bald Hill Road, Sunday 31 July from 7am to 6pm
- Main Street/Bald Hill Road closed between Webster Way and Station Street,
   Wednesday 3 August from 7am to 6pm



#### **Pedestrian**

 Main Street footpath closed at the level crossing, 1am Wednesday 27 July to 3am Monday 8 August



Pedestrian and vehicle access to private homes and businesses will be maintained at all times via traffic management.

Please observe detours and signage in place as you move around the area.

 Buses replace trains on sections of the Cranbourne and Pakenham lines from Wednesday 27 July to last service Sunday 7 August.



#### Designs for 2 new Pakenham stations released

Designs have been released for the brand-new Pakenham and East Pakenham stations, being built as part of the fast-tracked project to remove level crossings at McGregor Road, Main Street and Racecourse Road in Pakenham.

The station precinct designs reflect the community's desire for improved security, more green and landscaped areas and improved walking and cycling connections across Pakenham.

As a gateway to the town centre, the designs of Pakenham Station reflect the regional and metropolitan character of the suburb. The modern station's roof design is inspired by the local landscape of rolling hills and bronze sunsets.

We'll extend the metropolitan rail track by 2km and build a new East Pakenham Station to meet the needs of this fast-growing local community.

The project will also create the equivalent of 6 MCGs worth of new open space for locals to enjoy.

at McGregor Road, Main Street, and Racecourse Road by building a rail bridge over the roads and building new stations at Pakenham and East Pakenham.

The Victorian Government has fast tracked these level crossings for removal. rail line by two kilometres and as part of a \$15 billion investment to upgrade the Pakenham line which will be Station to meet the needs of this boom gate free by 2025. fast-growing local community.



#### Works notification: 24 hour works. Wednesday 27 July to Monday 8 August

We are removing the dangerous and congested level crossings at McGregor Road, Main Street and Racecourse Road, Pakenham by building a rail bridge over the roads and delivering new stations at Pakenham and East Pakenham.

From Wednesday 27 July to Monday 8 August, we will be working 24-hours a day within the rail corridor between Cardinia Station and East Pakenham while trains are not running. This will include excavation, fencing and track works within the rail corridor and overhead electrical works.

- . Noise and vibration from generators and construction machinery within the rail corridor
- . Lighting for safe working conditions during night works
- Construction activity and increased vehicle movements in the area

Ausnet Services will notify impacted residents and businesses ahead of time of any power interruptions associated with

**\*\*** The design of Pakenham Station will reflect the regional and metropolitan character of the suburb, featuring upgraded modern facilities, a new station forecourt and an integrated bus interchange.

The ground-level East Pakenham Station will have 4 tracks, reducing congestion and improving service reliability.
