

Works notice

Accessible tram stop construction Elizabeth Street and Royal Parade, Parkville

21 to 30 November 2023

The Parkville Station precinct has moved into the final phase of construction with reinstatement and public realm works underway.

These works include service relocations, footpath, kerb and road pavement construction, traffic signal modifications, and installation of bus stops, a new accessible tram stop, street furniture, lighting and landscaping. There will be changes to the way you move around the precinct during these works.

From 21 November, works will commence to construct an accessible tram stop on Elizabeth Street and Royal Parade, between Haymarket Roundabout and Genetics Lane.

The accessible tram stop is part of construction work for the future Parkville Station and will make it simple to switch between tram and train services when the Metro Tunnel opens in 2025.

The accessible tram stop will have raised platforms to allow improved access for people with accessibility requirements to low floor trams, as well as additional seating, shelters and accessible service information..

What we are doing

- Site establishment, including installing water barriers, temporary fencing and signage around the perimeter of the work site
- Removing existing road infrastructure in the Elizabeth Street and Royal Parade inner lanes, between Haymarket Roundabout and Genetics Lane, which includes non-destructive digging, excavation and saw cutting
- Installing permanent infrastructure, including underground services, traffic signals and tram network services
- Constructing kerb and road pavements and tram platforms
- Completing landscaping works including reinstatement of the tram corridor, adjacent medians, street furniture and other infrastructure related to the new tram stop
- Out of hours activities will occur as part of these works to minimise the impact on the public transport network
- There works are expected to generate intermittent periods of medium to high levels of noise.

What to be aware of

- From 21 to 30 November, 24/7 works will be undertaken in the Elizabeth Street/ Royal Parade tram corridor, between Haymarket roundabout and Story Street
- From first tram on Tuesday 21 November to last tram on Wednesday 29 November, buses will replace Route 19 trams on Elizabeth Street and Royal Parade, between Stop 7 Queen Victoria Market/Elizabeth Street and Stop 19 Brunswick Road/Sydney Road
- On 21 November, the Route 19 Stop 11 University of Melbourne/Royal Parade outbound tram stop, located near the Royal Melbourne Hospital car park, will permanently close
- The new Royal Melbourne Hospital/Royal Parade accessible tram stop will open on 30 November
- All northbound and southbound vehicle and cyclist access on Elizabeth Street and Royal Parade will be maintained via the outer lanes
- The right turn from the Royal Melbourne Hospital car park onto Royal Parade will remain closed until 30 November
- Emergency vehicle access to the Royal Melbourne Hospital will be maintained at all times via the Royal Parade/Grattan Street intersection
- A single east-west pedestrian crossing at the Royal Parade/Grattan Street intersection will be open, and will switch between the north and south side of Grattan Street during these works.

When

Working hours are:

- 24/7 Monday to Sunday.




Major 24/7 works in November 2023

From 21 November until 30 November, 24/7 construction works will occur on Elizabeth Street and Royal Parade, to construct the new accessible tram stop between Haymarket roundabout and Genetics Lane

Buses will replace Route 19 trams on Elizabeth Street and Royal Parade, between Stop 7 Queen Victoria Market/ Elizabeth Street and Stop 19 Brunswick Road/Sydney Road

The new Royal Melbourne Hospital/Royal Parade accessible tram stop will open on 30 November
