PAKENHAM UPDATE, MARCH 2024

#### We're upgrading major roads and removing the last three level crossings in Pakenham to improve journeys.


Work is full steam ahead to remove the level crossings at McGregor Road, Main Street and Racecourse Road. With the rail bridge in place, crews are installing sleepers and 7.8 kilometres of new track.

The new stations at Pakenham and East Pakenham will open to passengers later this year, with more services, and modern accessible facilities.

As we work towards opening the Metro Tunnel in 2025, there will be disruptions while we carry out testing. Pakenham Line trains will run through the new tunnel and its five new stations in and around the CBD.

Work is also progressing on upgrades to the Princes Freeway, McGregor Road and Racecourse Road and when complete will improve traffic flow around Pakenham.

We're getting closer to opening lanes on Healesville-Koo Wee Rup Road, from Manks Road through to Southeast Boulevard, providing safer travel, improved traffic flow and travel times.

#### **Road upgrades** in Pakenham

Things are looking a little different on Healesville-Koo Wee Rup Road, following a construction blitz over summer by the Pakenham Roads Upgrade team.

As part of the first stage of works, the road has been raised by nearly two metres at the southern roundabout at the Princes Freeway. The twelve 30-metre-long beams that will support the new bridge over the Princes Freeway have also been installed.

Major works have finished to widen the outbound McGregor Road exit ramp and the freeway roundabout on McGregor Road, between the freeway and the Webster Way/Henry Road intersection. Works to build a new lane on McGregor Road will start soon.

#### New stations for Pakenham passengers

The new Pakenham Station is taking shape, with the foundations laid, the state-of-the-art roof canopy installed and internal areas of the station buildings under construction

The roof canopy was made using 3D printing technology and moulded into shape using a high-tech durable material that's usually used in the aerospace and nautical industries.

Work is also progressing well at the new East Pakenham Station, the commuter car park is nearly complete and work is well underway to build the pedestrian underpass. Both stations will open later this year and will offer improved passenger facilities and safety, more green spaces, better access to shopping precincts and future connection to Suburban Rail Loop East.





## Pakenham Line and Metro Tunnel

Crews have been hard at work testing equipment and systems in the Metro Tunnel to ensure they are working seamlessly and safely for the Metro Tunnel to open to passengers a year ahead of schedule in 2025.

Once open, Pakenham Line trains will travel through the Metro Tunnel and continue onto Sunbury, allowing bigger and modern trains to run more often.

We'll need to close sections of the Pakenham and Gippsland lines while we carry out testing, with buses replacing trains at times from March to May.
