Landscaping - Trees

- West Gate Tunnel Project is delivering over 9 hectares of new green open space, made up of parks and wetlands.
- Additionally, a significant offset replanting initiative was set as one of the EPRs for the project
- Trees recognised as having high retention value that were required to be removed are being replaced at a 5:1 ratio project wide
- Not all trees removed were replaced at the 5:1 ratio with planted juvenile trees being replaced 1:1 and trees with low retention value such as dead or weed species not replaced
- Input from community members, water authorities and Councils has also helped to inform the plans for rehabilitating and landscaping on the project
- A 2-year maintenance period will be in place where CPBJH JV will be working with councils and Melbourne Water to ensure the plants are well looked after for their future survival





Landscaping – Tree numbers

- West Gate Tunnel Project is planting more than 26,800 number of trees project wide
- Approximately 5,100 trees were replaced at the 5:1 ratio
- An additional 700 trees were replaced 1:1
- Planting has already taken place across much of the west zone of the project with ongoing monitoring and maintenance to be undertaken



Landscaping - Locations

- Where possible, trees are being planted within the project corridor, however, barriers to planting such as space means trees are being planted in other locations within the impacted Council areas
- Environmental assessments and consultation with key interest groups including local Council were undertaken to determine the location and species selection of the trees being planted across the inner west
- Input from community members has also helped to inform our plans for rehabilitating and landscaping parts of the project

Offset replanting is set to occur in the following areas:

 Altona Memorial Park, Kororoit Creek Reserve, Federation Trail, GJ Hosken Reserve, McIvor Reserve, Footscray Baseball Club, Cruckshank Park, Stony Creek, West Gate Golf Club, Anderson Reserve, West Gate Park and Citylink (Batman Ave & Power St)






Landscaping - Species

- There has been a focus on planting native species that will complement and adapt well to existing local environment
- Choosing a right mix of species to highlight indigenous vegetation and increase biodiversity and habitats along the project corridor has been a major focus of all landscaping packages
- The species selected to be planted across the project included a mix of:
 - Ground-covers
 - Native grasses
 - Native trees
 - Large and small shrub
 - Water sensitive urban design (WSUD) plants
 - Exotic trees
 - Mature and juvenile trees
 - Indigenous species






