1 Executive Summary

Healesville-Koo Wee Rup Road Project (the Project) is a ten-kilometre duplication of Healesville-Koo Wee Rup Road between Manks Road and Princes Freeway East.

On 23 August 2019, a decision made by Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (DCCEEW) (the Department) under s. 75 of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act* 1999 (Cth) (EPBC Act) determined that the Project is a 'controlled action' requiring assessment and approval. The Department approved the project as a controlled action with conditions on 18 September 2020. Subsequent variations to the approval occurred on 6 July 2021, 10 December 2021 and 22 December 2023 (listed in **Appendix B**).

Under Condition 11 of the decision notice, an annual compliance report is required to be published on Victoria's Big Build website. The report must address compliance with each of the conditions of the approval, including implementation of any management plans, as specified in the conditions.

This compliance report addresses the current status of the Project against the conditions of the EPBC Act Approval No. 2019/8487. This is the thirds compliance report prepared for the Project and relates to the period of 18 January 2024 to 17 January 2025.

MRPV is compliant with all conditions referenced in EPBC Act Approval No. 2019/8487 for this annual reporting period.

2 Introduction

2.1 Purpose of this report

The purpose of this report is to detail the compliance status of the Healesville – Koo Wee Rup Road Upgrade (the Project) in accordance with Condition 11 of Part B – Standard Administrative Conditions of Approval No. 2019/8487 under the EPBC Act.

2.2 Background

The Project involves the duplication of Healesville-Koo Wee Rup Road between approximately Manks Road and Princes Freeway East. The Project is being delivered in two packages led by separate Contractors, the Healesville-Koo Wee Rup Upgrade (North Section) and the Healesville-Koo Wee Rup Upgrade (South Section).

On 23 August 2019, a decision made by Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (DCCEEW) (the Department) under s. 75 of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act* 1999 (Cth) (EPBC Act) determined that the Project is a 'controlled action' requiring assessment and approval. The Department approved the project as a controlled action with conditions on 18 September 2020. Subsequent variations to the approval occurred on 6 July 2021, 10 December 2021 and 22 December 2023. A Project map is provided in **Appendix A** of this report.

The approval to Referral No. 2019/8487 under the EBPC Act was given to the Department of Transport (ABN 69 981 208 782) with respect to the construction of the Project. As an entity of Department of Transport (now Department of Transport and Planning), MRPV is responsible for the delivery of the Action for this reporting period.

2.3 Description of activities

The approved action is to duplicate approximately 10 kilometres of the Healesville – Koo Wee Rup Road between Manks Road and Princes Freeway East. Construction of the core components of the project are complete however landscaping and monitoring is ongoing.
