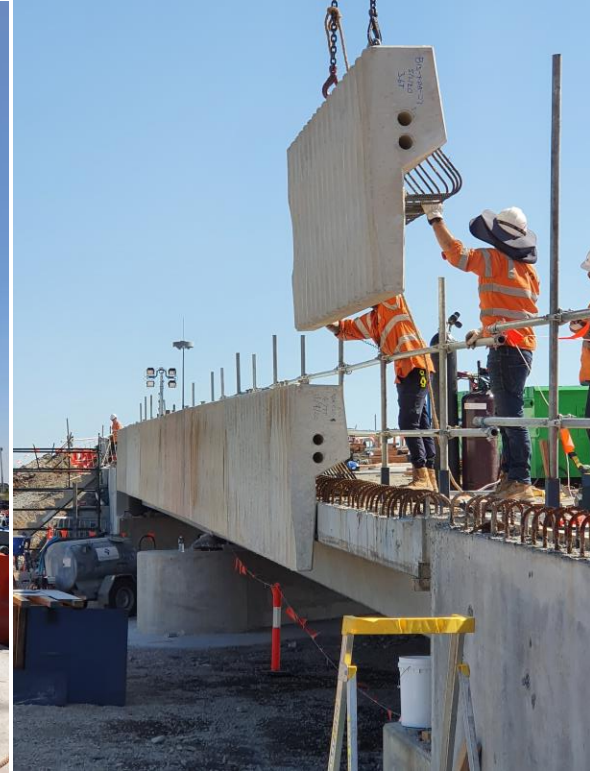

Managing rock and soil from the West Gate Tunnel

To build the West Gate Tunnel, approximately 1.5 million cubic meters of rock and soil will need to be managed.

Digging up this amount of soil to build the West Gate Tunnels will be a 24/7 operation at our temporary holding site.

The project parties are working to find a long-term solution to safely manage the rock and soil created during tunnelling. This includes finding a permanent disposal site, and having a temporary, back-up holding site, to be used only when the permanent site can't be accessed.

Given the West Gate Tunnel Project is being built in former industrial areas, our extensive testing has found low levels of the group of chemicals known as PFAS will be found in some of the excavated soil during tunnelling.

To ensure it is managed safely for workers and the community, EPA Victoria and Worksafe Victoria requirements will be met at every step of the way.

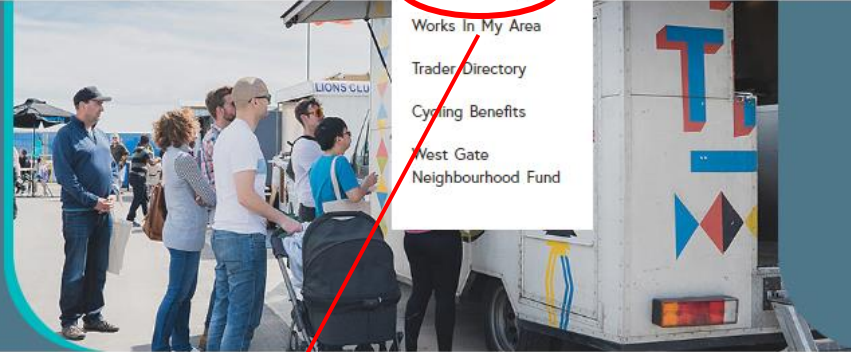

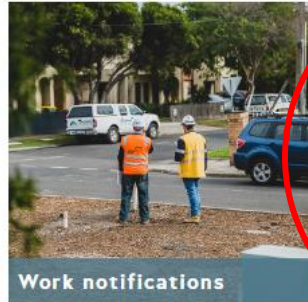

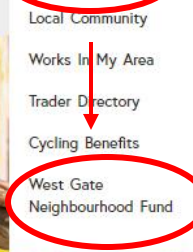

## West Gate Neighbourhood Fund

Partnerships applications are now closed



### The West Gate Neighbourhood Fund has been established by the Victorian Government to support communities in Melbourne's inner west during the construction of the West Gate Tunnel Project.

The \$10 million government fund is managed by the West Gate Tunnel Project, Major Transport Infrastructure Authority, who are also responsible for managing the West Gate Tunnel Project on behalf of the Victorian Government.

Offered in two components – partnerships and grants, the West Gate Neighbourhood Fund will allow not-for-profit groups to access funding for projects that bring people together and build community capacity.

The program is designed to support these inner west communities, prioritising those who are most affected by the construction of the West Gate Tunnel Project, ensuring that the benefits of the project to the local community start now.

A range of activities will be eligible for funding through the program, including projects that:

- celebrate heritage, history or diversity,
- contribute to safe and liveable environments,
- focus on arts and culture,
- emphasise learning and development, or
- enable greater participation and access of community members.

There will be one round of partnerships and one round of grants each financial year.

### Partnerships applications are now closed

Hobsons Bay City Council and Maribyrnong City Council are assisting with this program under the direction of WGTP, MTIA by making available their grants application system, and for entering into further agreements with successful applicants.
