Following these approvals, we can award the contract.</li> <li>We've commenced formal contract negotiations and are working with the McConnell Dowell Decmil Joint Venture (the JV) on a couple of items coming out of the EES.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Design:         <ul> <li>MRPV is reviewing design drawings from the JV and is working through all refinements in the Preliminary Design Phase to finalise the Detailed Design.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Discussion:         <ul> <li>Members questioned where the JV will start work and when trucks will start entering the site.             <ul> <li>The Construction Plans are being finalised but works will start enter will be sent to nearby residents to advise of works starting.</li> <li>Parks Victoria is providing information regarding the relocation of their lunch room facility and the condition of the current building.</li> <li>Businesses nearby the alignment have been invited to complete a survey to let us know their requirements during construction.</li> <li>Pre-construction property condition survey offers have been sent to properties bordering the alignment.</li> </ul> </li> </ul></li></ul>	Daniel Kollmorgen	15 mins
3	<ul> <li>Project Update – McConnell Dowell Decmil Joint Venture</li> <li><u>Traffic Movements:</u> <ul> <li>The JV has prepared traffic management plans to reduce the impact to traffic during construction.</li> <li>The plans include information on minimising number of roads closed at any one time, the duration of temporary lane closures, and the amount of works that affect motorists during peak periods.</li> <li>There will be a lot of trucks coming to and from site during construction.</li> <li>The JV will minimise impacts by planning truck routes to limit the distances they travel on local roads, source material from multiple quarries and use temporary haul roads to take trucks off local roads.</li> <li>Safety barriers will be installed to separate drivers from construction works and signs will guide motorists through changed traffic conditions. 	<ul> <li><u>Community Engagement:</u> <ul> <li>A Construction Communications and Community Engagement plan has been developed and approved. The Plan includes information on the approach, tools and timeframes for responding to enquiries.</li> <li>Letters will be sent to nearby residents prior to major works. Letters will be sent to the general community and door knocks will sometimes happen only to those who will be directly impacted.</li> <li>A plan to manage local businesses has also been developed. This has been informed by response to a survey distributed to businesses.</li> <li>All businesses will receive the same service. Enquiries and complaints have agreed response times. High priority complaints will be responded to straight away, and contact can be made through MRPV's 24-hour phone line.</li> <li>All plans developed include looking at events and opportunities for the community to be involved.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Discussion:         <ul> <li>The JV was asked how they will manage the number of trucks coming to site and which intersections will be used.             <ul> <li>The JV will manage trucks from the quarry to make sure they'll get to and from the site with minimal disruption to the community. It's expected the southern section of the job will be the busiest.</li> <li>Some lane closures and speed reductions will also be needed.</li> </ul> </li> <li>The quality of Governor Road will be monitored during construction to understand its condition.</li> <li>The rewill be up to 200 workers on site and they and the community needs to be kept safe during construction.</li> <li>There may be events to announce works starting and during construction when milestones are reached.</li> <li>Emails will occasionally be sent out to people who have subscribed to receive project updates through the MRPV website.</li>               T</ul></li></ul>
