



Reinstatement and public realm works

Grattan Street west, between Flemington Road and Royal Parade

From Tuesday 11 July to late 2023

The Parkville Station precinct is moving into the final phase of construction with reinstatement and public realm works underway.

Throughout the Parkville precinct, staged reinstatement and public realm works are ongoing until early 2024. These works include service relocations, footpath, kerb and road pavement construction, traffic signal modifications, and the installation of bus stops, street furniture, lighting and landscaping.

Reinstatement and public realm works will take place up to property boundaries, including on footpaths and directly adjacent to building entrances. There will be changes to the way you move around the precinct during these works.

On the northwest corner of Grattan Street west and Royal Parade, reinstatement and public realm works are expected to be complete on the eastbound traffic lane by 11 July.

Once complete, the next stage of reinstatement and public realm works will commence on the southern side of Grattan Street, between Flemington Road and Royal Parade.

What we are doing

- Site establishment including installing traffic barriers, temporary fencing and signage around the perimeter of the work site
- Removing sections of the existing westbound traffic lane, southern footpath, kerbs and road surface which includes non-destructive digging, excavating and saw cutting
- Installing new infrastructure including stormwater drainage, street lighting, traffic signals, and other underground services and utilities
- Landscaping works including installing street furniture such as benches, bollards, signage and bus stops

 Reconstructing the westbound traffic lane, footpath, kerbs and road surface involving laying bluestone, asphalting and line marking.


What to be aware of

- The footpath on the corner of Grattan Street and Royal Parade, in front of the Royal Melbourne Hospital, will re-open
- The northern east-west pedestrian crossing at the intersection of Royal Parade and Grattan Street will re-open
- The Grattan Street eastbound lane, between Flemington Road and Royal Parade/Elizabeth Street, will temporarily re-open to maintain hospital drop-off/ pick-up and access for emergency services, replacing the U-turn manoeuvre
- Vehicles and cyclists will be able to travel eastbound on Grattan Street from Flemington Road and turn left onto Royal Parade. There will be no right hand turn onto Elizabeth Street from Grattan Street
- The Grattan Street westbound lane, between Flemington Road and Royal Parade/Elizabeth Street, will remain closed
- Emergency vehicles access to and from the Royal Melbourne Hospital will be maintained at all times
- A dedicated westbound emergency vehicle lane will open on Grattan Street, between Flemington Road and The Royal Melbourne Hospital
- Patient drop-off/pick-up and short-term parking will be maintained on the northern side of Grattan Street
- Two patient pick-up/drop-off spaces for the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre will be reinstated at the Elizabeth Street service lane









Indicative Only

- Traffic management and signage will be in place to safely direct vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians around the work area
- A section of the southern Grattan Street footpath, adjacent to Elizabeth Street, will close and a minor pedestrian detour will be in place
- Access to local hospitals, buildings and businesses will be maintained at all times
- From October, the western north-south Grattan Street crossing at the Royal Parade intersection will open and the mid-block pedestrian crossing at Grattan Street west will close
- Separate notification will be provided about further pedestrian and access changes
- Wayfinding signage will be installed around the precinct to assist pedestrian movements
- These works are expected to generate periods of medium to high level noise, depending on the work activity
- Works will be completed during the day, with night works also taking place from 11 July to late July, and as required for the remainder of the works

- These works are weather dependent
- Other Metro Tunnel works are occurring in the Parkville Station precinct. These works may result in additional changes to how pedestrians, cyclists and vehicles use the area.
