Activities and exercises involving emergency services will take place at Anzac Station as part of getting the Metro Tunnel ready for operations.

When we'll be working

We'll be working from
7am to 5pm on Tuesday
22 April 2025.

What we'll be doing

- Conducting exercises inside the station and tunnels
- Carrying equipment in and out of the station, including emergency services equipment such as stretchers and firefighting equipment
- Parking emergency service vehicles including fire trucks, ambulance vehicles and police vehicles and other marked vehicles in parking bays around Anzac Station.

What to be aware of

- At times, there may be low levels of noise associated with these activities and exercises
- Emergency services vehicles will be parked in some parking bays around Anzac Station from 7am to 5pm including on:
 - Domain Road between St Kilda Road and Dallas Brooks Drive
 - Albert Road between St Kilda Road and Albert Road south
 - St Kilda Road between Bowen Lane and Albert Road south.

- At times during the day, equipment may be dropped off and picked up from around the station
- At times during the day, you may see firefighters, police, SES or paramedics moving in and around the station
- There will be no testing of alarms
- There will be no changes to tram services or traffic.
