

# Works notice

## Reinstatement and public realm works Grattan Street east site

**Week of 21 August to late October 2023**

The Parkville Station precinct has moved into the final phase of construction with reinstatement and public realm works underway.

Throughout the Parkville precinct, staged reinstatement and public realm works are ongoing until early 2024. These works include service relocations, footpath, kerb and road pavement construction, traffic signal modifications, and installation of bus stops, street furniture, lighting and landscaping.

Reinstatement and public realm works will take place up to property boundaries, including on footpaths and directly adjacent to building entrances. There will be changes to the way you move around the precinct during these works.

From the week of 21 August, reinstatement and public realm works will commence on the southern Grattan Street footpath, between Elizabeth and Barry streets.

### What we are doing

- Site establishment, including removing water filled barriers and installing temporary fencing and signage around the perimeter of the work site
- Removing the existing southern Grattan Street footpath between Elizabeth and Barry streets, which includes non-destructive digging, excavating and saw cutting
- Installing new infrastructure, underground services and utilities, and street lighting
- Landscaping works including constructing the permanent bluestone footpath, adjacent kerbs, sections of roadway, and installing street furniture and bus stops.

### What to be aware of

- The southern Grattan Street footpath, between Elizabeth and Barry streets, and alongside the Doherty Institute and Alan Gilbert Building, will be occupied during these works
- East-west pedestrian access between Elizabeth and Barry streets will be maintained via a minor diversion through the Grattan Street east site
- Access to the Doherty Institute's Grattan Street entrance and 24/7 drop boxes will be maintained via the diversion

- Access to the Alan Gilbert Building's Grattan Street entrance will be maintained via the diversion
- Emergency egress from all local buildings will be maintained at all times
- Concrete pours will take place intermittently throughout the works. During concrete pours, there will be short term closures of the pedestrian diversion
- During short-term closures, pedestrian diversions will be in place via Pelham, Berkeley Street and Barry streets, and Haymarket Walk
- Works on the northern Grattan Street footpath will then commence and be completed concurrently, with pedestrians diverted through the Grattan Street east site. Access to and emergency egress from the University of Melbourne Medical Building will be maintained. Separate notification will be provided for these works
- Water main property connections will also be completed from within this site. These connections will not impact local supply to nearby buildings
- Traffic management will be in place to manage all closures and diversions
- These works are expected to take place during normal working hours only. If required, works will be completed overnight
- Stakeholders will be notified separately prior to any short-term closures or out-of-hours works
- These works are expected to generate medium levels of noise, with intermittent period of high-level noise.

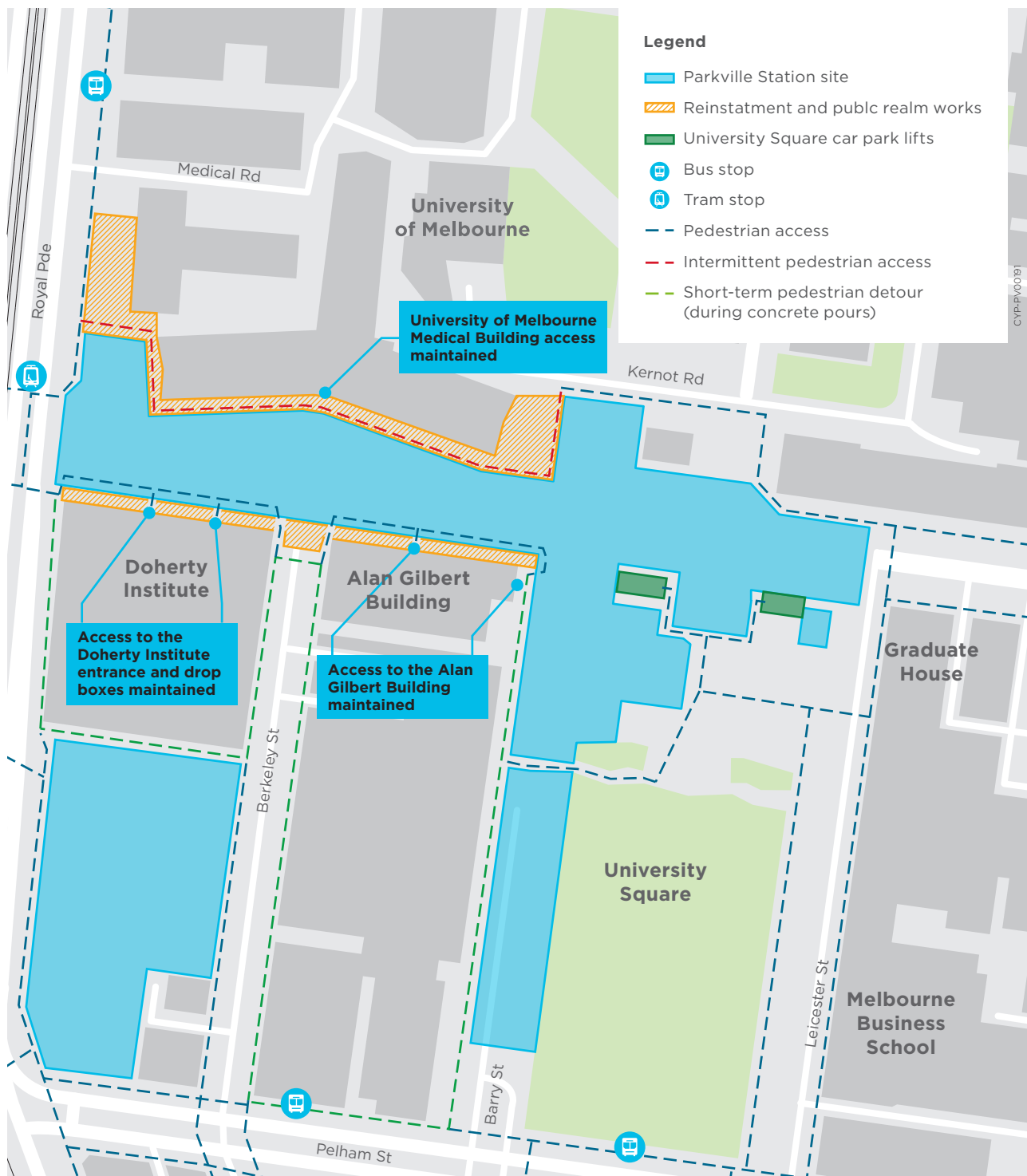
