

Construction update



Domain Precinct

July 2024

Works to construct the Metro Tunnel's Anzac Station are progressing. This update provides an outline of current and upcoming works in your area in July 2024.

Works snapshot: July

In June, we completed the landscaping in the median of St Kilda Road between Toorak Road and Bowen Lane. Work on the forecourt of the Albert Road Reserve entrance is well advanced with paving continuing around the new station entrance and lifts. Work is also well progressed on the South African Soldiers' Memorial.

In July 2024 works within the Domain precinct will focus on landscaping adjacent to the Shrine entrance, including construction of the pedestrian footpath along St Kilda Road and the reinstatement works at Edmund Herring Oval.

Later in 2024 works will focus on completing the South African Soldiers' Memorial reinstatement, reopening Domain Road, opening the Albert Road green link parkland and returning Edmund Herring Oval to the community. We'll also continue station construction, utility connections, kerbing works, separated bike lane installation adjacent to the Albert Road Reserve entrance, as well as landscaping and planting.

Construction works within the Domain precinct during July 2024 will include:

- Reinstatement works on Domain Road and construction of a new tram and bus stop
- Edmund Herring Oval reinstatement works
- Station entrance construction
- Asphaltting, median works and construction of footpaths
- South African Soldiers' Memorial reinstatement
- Station fit out.

Upcoming works in your area

Domain Road construction and Edmund Herring Oval reinstatement

Between St Kilda Road and Domain Street

Ongoing – 2024

- Underground services installation along Domain Road will continue in July, using saw cutters, excavators, Non-Destructive Digging and hand tools
- Sections of the final footpath asphalting will take place during July school holidays, where it impacts access to Melbourne Grammar School. This may require some short term closures of the footpath along Domain Road
- The removal of the materials at Edmund Herring Oval will continue in July, this involves the demolition of the temporary road on Edmund Herring Oval
- Domain Road reinstatement continues and is expected to re-open later in 2024.



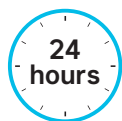
- These asphalting works are expected to generate medium levels of noise with minor profiling of the road and laying of asphalt
- Works will also take place overnight to remove the temporary fencing adjacent to the tram tracks between Toorak Road and Bowen Lane
- The permanent tactiles will also be installed at the St Kilda Road pedestrian crossing at Bowen Lane.

St Kilda Road asphalting and median works

St Kilda Road Southbound

Early July

- In July, the left turn lane from St Kilda Road to into Domain Road will be asphalted overnight
- The works will require the overnight closure of St Kilda Road southbound, with traffic detouring via Dorcas Street and Kings Way

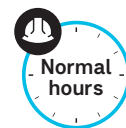


Path reinstatement to Shrine of Remembrance grounds

Adjacent to The Cobbers sculpture

July-August 2024

- Works have commenced on the construction of the legacy footpath connecting the St Kilda Road footpath to the Shrine of Remembrance grounds
- This will require the closure of the existing footpath connecting to The Cobbers sculpture and the Macpherson Robertson Fountain
- Pedestrian detours will be in place while the final legacy footpath is constructed
- These works will involve the use of excavators and asphalting for the new footpath before the area is landscaped.



Station entrances construction

Albert Road Reserve, west entrance



Ongoing – 2024

- During July works will continue on the station entrance forecourt, including concrete pours and the laying of bluestone pavers around the entrance
- Works are continuing on the reinstatement of the South African Soldiers' Memorial
- Works inside the station entrance will continue until 1am each night
- Hard landscaping works around the station entrance will continue in July, including installation of kerbs, footpaths, bike lane and retaining walls.

Shrine of Remembrance, east entrance



Ongoing – 2024

- Hard landscaping works around the station entrance will continue in July, works will include installation of kerbs, footpaths, retaining walls and garden beds
- Works inside the station entrance will continue until 1am each night.

Concourse and platform level of station box

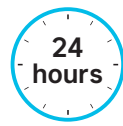


Ongoing

- Major construction and finishing works have been completed on the Anzac Station platforms
- Final works are continuing on the Anzac Station concourse
- Internal system testing is now underway within the station.

Intermittent construction barrier removal and set up

St Kilda Road and Albert Road

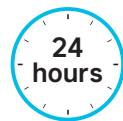


Ongoing until 2025

- As we complete works areas across the project area, barrier removal and line marking will take place to return these areas to the public or to set up new construction areas for finishing works
- To minimise disruption to traffic these works must take place at night when there is less traffic and will require intermittent night time closures of St Kilda Road
- These works involve small cranes to load the construction barriers onto or off trucks, traffic management, light towers, spotters with whistles for the safety of works, asphaltting and line marking machines
- Notification will be provided closer to the works commencing.

Overnight Water Connection Works

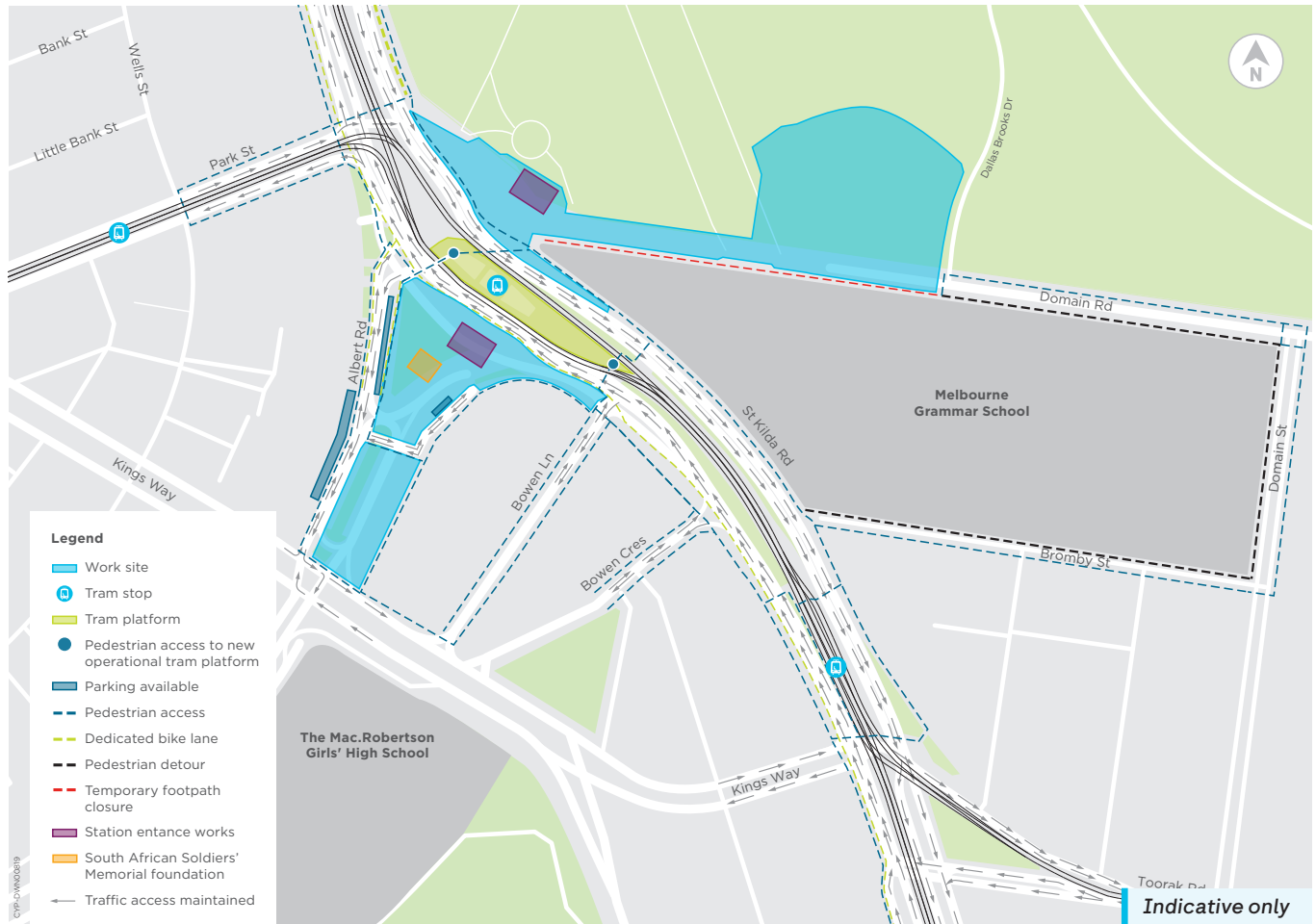
Corner of Bowen Crescent and St Kilda Road



11 to 12 July 2024

- As part of works to lower a fire hydrant connection, overnight works will take place at the corner of Bowen Crescent and St Kilda Road
- This will involve saw cutting and the use of a non-destructive digging (NDD) truck
- The works are expected to generate medium to high levels of noise associated with the use of the NDD truck
- South East Water will notify separately of any overnight impact to building water supply.

Traffic and transport impacts July 2024

Oversized deliveries

- While most deliveries to the Anzac Station site will occur during normal hours, some deliveries to and from site that are classified as 'oversized' will be required outside of normal working hours and overnight. Whenever oversized deliveries are expected overnight, crews will be reminded of noise requirements on site.

Shrine of Remembrance pedestrian access

- The St Kilda Road footpath leading to The Cobbers sculpture and the Macpherson Robertson Fountain will be closed in July to build the legacy footpath. A pedestrian detour will be in place during these works.

Domain Road pedestrian footpath

- The pedestrian footpath from St Kilda Road up Domain Road will close for up to 3 days during the July school holidays to complete the final layer of asphaltting

St Kilda Road overnight closures

- - In July, St Kilda Road will be closed overnight at times for finishing works along the northbound and southbound lanes.
