# Works notification

## South Geelong to Waurn Ponds Duplication

31 March – 14 April 2025

**Major construction on the South Geelong to Waurn Ponds Duplication is complete, with two dangerous level crossings removed and the rebuild of two stations for passengers on Victoria's busiest regional rail line.**

### What we're doing

We are completing all outstanding works between South Geelong and Waurn Ponds. Works will take place from **7am to 7pm, Monday 31 March to Monday 14 April.**

During this time, we will:

- Undertake track maintenance works in sections between South Geelong and Waurn Ponds, such as rail tampering. Nearby residents will be contacted directly about increased noise for short periods of time during the day between **Monday 31 March and Monday 7 April.**
- Install safety bollards, handrails and signage along the rail corridor between South Geelong and Waurn Ponds.
- Continue landscaping including hydroseeding, plant maintenance and weed removal.

### Changes to the way you travel

Coaches will replace trains on sections of the Geelong and Warrnambool line between **Monday 31 March and Monday 14 April 2025** to allow the project to complete all outstanding works.
