West Gate Tunnel Project (MTIA) Update

West Gate Neighbourhood Fund

SP5 of the Environmental Performance Requirements (EPR)

Develop and implement a Community Involvement and Participation Plan in consultation with Hobsons Bay City Council and Maribyrnong City Council and representatives of communities affected negatively by the impacts of the project, including Altona North, Brooklyn, South Kingsville, Spotswood and Yarraville, in order to improve community connectedness and cohesiveness

West Gate Neighbourhood Fund

- **\$10 million** through grants and partnerships.
- The West Gate Neighbourhood Fund will be State funded and managed by West Gate Tunnel Project Major Transport Infrastructure Authority – WGTP MTIA.
- It will run over two financial years.
- Applications will be via the West Gate Tunnel Project website.
- Community consultation sessions have been conducted



Partnerships

- Upwards of \$100,000 per partnership will be available to deliver projects to improve community connectedness and cohesion in the municipalities of Hobsons Bay and Maribyrnong.
- Co-contribution funding and in-kind contributions will be considered favourably in the assessment process, in order to increase benefits to the community.
- Councils and incorporated groups within the local government areas of Maribyrnong City Council and Hobsons Bay City Council can apply.



Community grants

The grants stream will launch in early 2020 and will comprise three streams of funding:

- Connecting community grants – small projects and activities which improve community connectedness (up to **\$10,000** per application)
- Activating community grants – space activation and events (up to **\$20,000** per application)
- Transforming community grants – community, sporting, and recreation facilities (**\$20,001** to **\$100,000** per application)

Assessment criteria

Applications for Grants and Partnerships will be assessed on the capacity of the proposal to:

- Improve community connectedness.
- Improve community cohesiveness.
- Meet a community need.
- Be successfully delivered by the organisation.
- Be completed by the end of 2022.

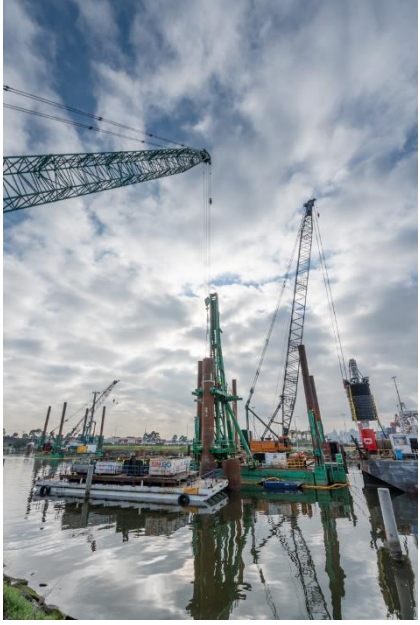

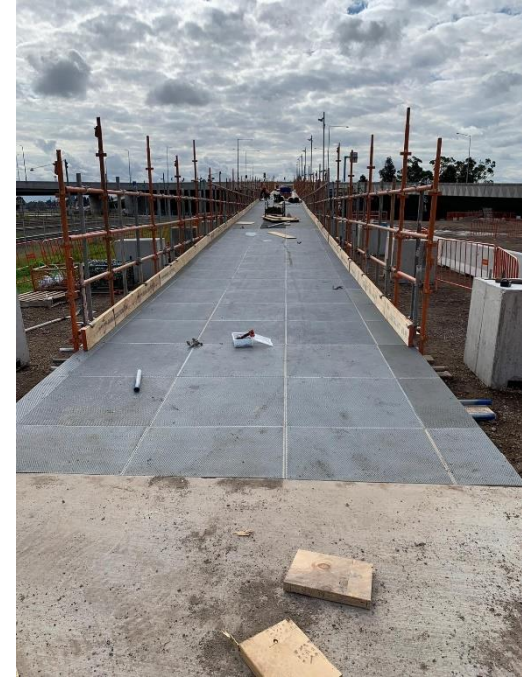

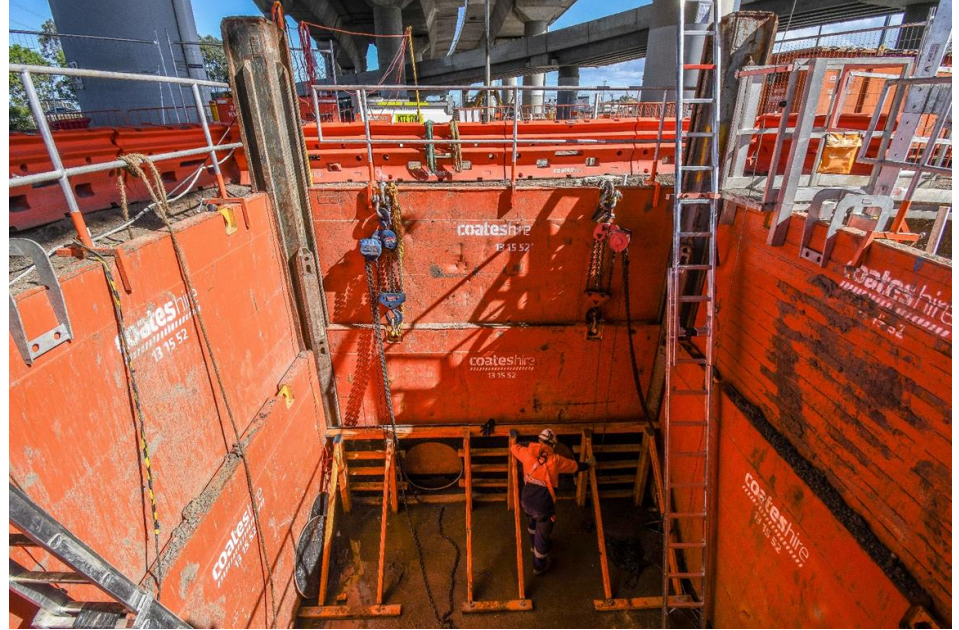
