

# **Works notice**

# Light pole installation and temporary closure of Childers Street

Childers Street, Kensington

Saturday 29 April 2023

As previously notified in the April & May bi-monthly construction update, works to install new lighting within the Childers Street forecourt works area will take place in April.

To ensure the safety of road users a temporary closure of Childers Street will be required for up to one day.

#### What we are doing

- Installing 5 light poles within the new South Kensington Station forecourt works area
- Works will involve a non-destructive digging (NDD) truck to excavate the ground. NDD uses high-pressurised water to dig the ground without damaging any existing services located underground
- Using a truck to deliver light poles and a crane to lift them into place.

#### When


- 7am to 5pm Saturday 29 April.

### What you should be aware of

- The installation of 5 light poles is expected to generate medium levels of noise with intermittent periods of high levels of noise
- To ensure the safety of road users and to avoid long-term traffic delays, a temporary closure of the east end of Childers Street will be required during this time. The closure will be in place between the Bill Vanina Pavilion and Ormond Street, Kensington
- Car parking between Kensington Road and the Bill Vanina Pavilion will remain available including two accessible parking spaces and a vehicle turn around area
- During this time, traffic management will be reinstated, including an over-height vehicle detour via Derby and Tennyson streets and cyclist detour via Altona Street and Kensington Road, please see the map below
- Pedestrian access to South Kensington Station will be maintained at all times.
