Overnight Asphalting

St Kilda Road

March 2024

In March we will complete asphalting on St Kilda Road to reinstate two lanes in each direction through the Metro Tunnel Project area.



When we'll be working

To safely complete these works and minimise disruption to traffic on St Kilda Road works will take place overnight, **8pm to 6am**

- Northbound and southbound lanes:
 8pm Wednesday 13 March to 6am Saturday 16 March 2024
- Northbound and southbound lanes:
 8pm Sunday 17 March to 6am Friday 22 March 2024

The timing of work may change depending on weather.

What we'll be doing

- Closing the northbound lanes of St Kilda Road between Kings Way and Albert Road overnight to:
 - Remove parts of the existing road surface and lay new asphalt along sections of the northbound lanes
 - Excavate a conduit pit using Non-Destructive Digging (NDD) trucks
 - Install car detector loops in asphalt at intersections and pedestrian crossings

- Closing the southbound lanes of St Kilda Road between Park Street and Bromby Street overnight to:
 - Remove parts of the existing road surface and lay new asphalt along sections of the southbound lanes
 - Install car detector loops in asphalt at intersections and pedestrian crossings
- Removing traffic barriers and line marking.

What to be aware of

- St Kilda Road will be closed in both directions during these works
- Detours will be in place during the closure of St Kilda Road, with access around the works via Kings Way (See map)
- During works on northbound lanes, access and egress for the driveway of Domain Hill will be via Kings Way
- During works on the northbound lanes, access and egress for the St Kilda Road driveway of 400 St Kilda Road (Botanica) will be primarily via Bowen Crescent, with Bowen Lane as an alternative route (See map). Botanica residents will be advised separately when the Bowen Lane detour is in use
- Access to properties will be maintained at all times, with traffic controllers in place to assist with changes to access and guide traffic around the works area
- Please expect periods of delays

- overnight when asphalting is adjacent to the driveways
- The conduit excavation areas will require periods of high-level noise associated with the use of the NDD truck
- Car detector loop installation takes approximately an hour per location and can generate periods of high level noise during the cutting of asphalt to install the detector loop
- Removing the existing road surface and laying new asphalt are expected to generate periods of medium levels of noise.

Where

- Asphalting works will be taking place at multiple locations over the course of the works
- Due to the nature of these works, progress may be impacted by weather conditions.



Closure of St Kilda Road over the easter school holidays, 8-13 April

Following the completion of the asphalting of St Kilda Road, the team will construct tram tracks from St Kilda Road into Domain Road.

The connection of these tram tracks will require a week-long closure of the southbound lane of St Kilda Road (away from city) and involve overnight works. Pedestrian, traffic and bicycle detours will be in place. Tram services will not be affected by the works.

These works will take place Monday 8 April to Saturday 13 April 2024. Further information will be provided closer to the date of these works.

What is Non-Destructive Digging?

Non-Destructive Digging, or NDD, uses high-pressure water to excavate the ground.

This method enables digging without damaging or impacting the existing ground srevices, allowing for careful investigation of existing services.
