

Construction update



Domain Precinct

August 2024

Works to construct the Metro Tunnel's Anzac Station are nearing completion, with good progress on the final major works above ground. This update provides an outline of current and upcoming works in your area in August 2024.

Works snapshot: August

In July, we completed the asphaltting of the left turn from St Kilda Road to Domain Road, reopened the southbound bike lanes along St Kilda Road, and reopened the footpath connection from St Kilda Road to the Shrine of Remembrance. Work on the forecourt of the Albert Road Reserve entrance is well advanced with paving continuing around the new station entrance and lifts. Work is also well progressed on the South African Soldiers' Memorial.

In August 2024 works within the Domain precinct will focus on landscaping adjacent to the Shrine entrance, and the reinstatement works at Edmund Herring Oval.

Later in 2024 works will focus on reopening Domain Road, opening the Albert Road green link parkland and returning Edmund Herring Oval to the community. We'll also continue station construction, utility connections, kerbing works, as well as landscaping and planting.

- Reinstatement works on Domain Road and construction of a new tram and bus stop
- Edmund Herring Oval reinstatement works
- Station entrance construction
- Asphaltting, median works and construction of footpaths
- South African Soldiers' Memorial reinstatement
- Station fit out.

Upcoming works in your area

Domain Road construction and Edmund Herring Oval reinstatement

Between St Kilda Road and Domain Street

Ongoing – 2024

- Underground services installation along Domain Road will continue in August, using saw cutters, excavators, Non-Destructive Digging and hand tools
- Final footpath asphaltting will take place in August. Where it impacts access to Melbourne Grammar School, works may take place overnight
- The reinstatement of Edmund Herring Oval will continue in August.

Albert Road Reserve, west entrance

Ongoing – 2024

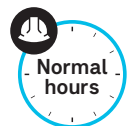
- During August, works will continue on the station entrance forecourt, including concrete pours and the laying of bluestone pavers around the entrance
- Works are continuing on the reinstatement of the South African Soldiers' Memorial
- Works will continue on the Albert Road South connection to St Kilda Road, including installation of bluestone pavers
- Hard landscaping works around the station entrance will continue in August, including installation of kerbs, footpaths, and retaining walls.

Ongoing – 2024

- Hard landscaping works around the station entrance will continue in August, and will include installation of kerbs, footpaths, retaining walls and garden beds
- Works inside the station entrance will continue until 1am each night.

Concourse and platform level of station box

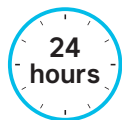
Ongoing

- Major construction and finishing works have been completed on the Anzac Station platforms
- Final works are continuing on the Anzac Station concourse
- Internal system testing is now underway within the station.



Intermittent construction barrier removal and set up

St Kilda Road and Albert Road



Ongoing until 2025

- As we complete works areas across the project area, barrier removal and line marking will take place to return these areas to the public or to set up new construction areas for finishing works
- To minimise disruption to traffic these works must take place at night when there is less traffic and will require intermittent night time closures of St Kilda Road
- These works involve small cranes to load the construction barriers onto or off trucks, traffic management, light towers, spotters with whistles for the safety of works, asphaltting and line marking machines
- Notification will be provided closer to the works commencing.

Traffic and transport impacts August 2024

Oversized deliveries

- While most deliveries to the Anzac Station site will occur during normal hours, some deliveries to and from site that are classified as 'oversized' will be required outside of normal working hours and overnight. Whenever oversized deliveries are expected overnight, crews will be reminded of noise requirements on site.

Smoke Testing at Anzac Station

As part of the process to test the emergency smoke extraction systems at Anzac Station, tests will take place from 6pm Monday 19 August 2024 to 1am Tuesday 20 August 2024.

The tests involve generation of an odorless smoke within the station, to test the extraction from the station concourse and platform levels.

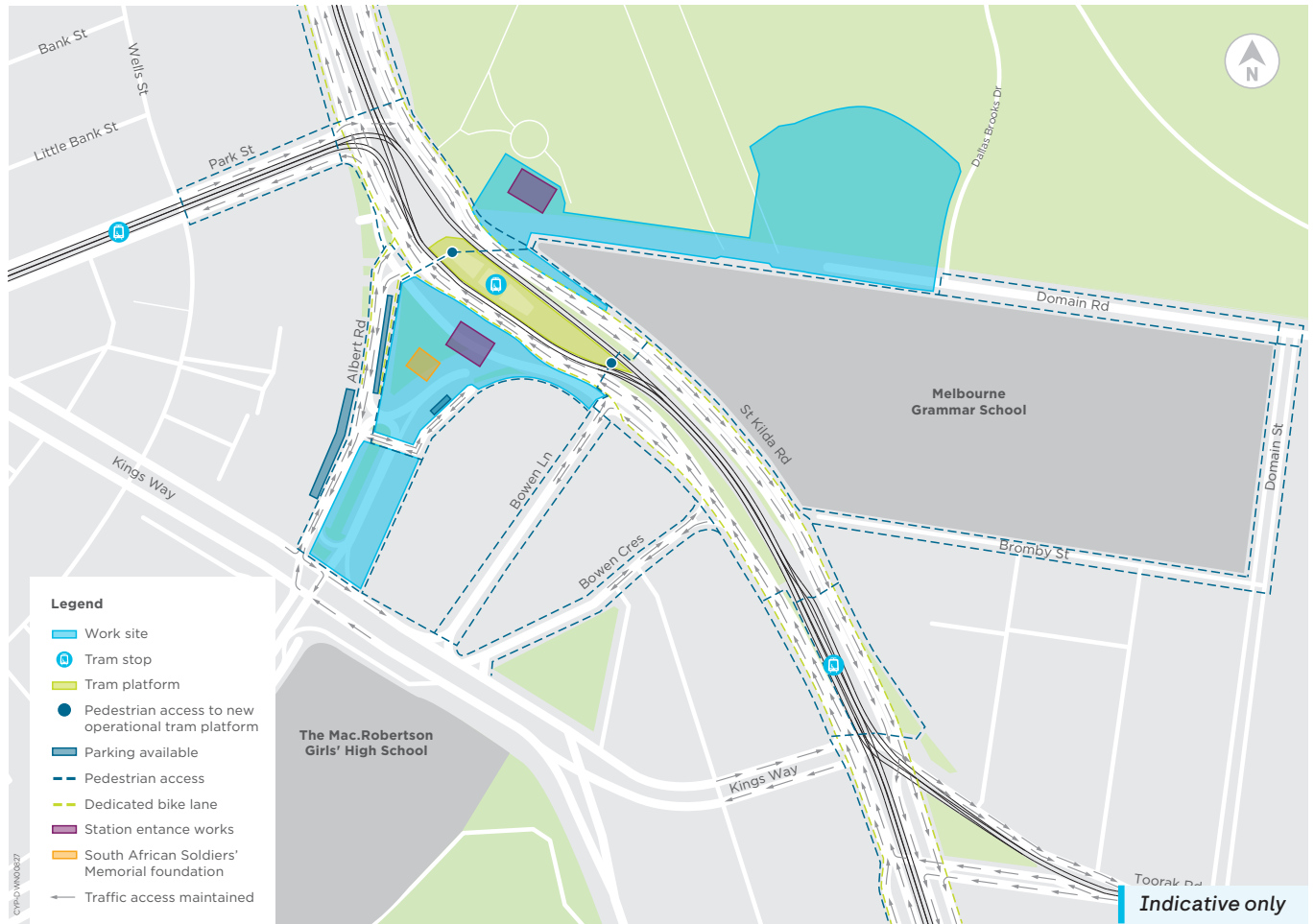
Some smoke may be visible from the stations ventilation systems on St Kilda Road. This is specialty simulation smoke that will dissipate quickly once outdoors and will not impact local air quality. Audible alarms will not be triggered during the testing.
