






SRLA update

- CRG survey open until 5pm Friday 23 August
- Stabling Network Support Facility (NSF) Urban Design and Landscape Plan was approved on 19 July 2024
 - Based on community and stakeholder feedback the upper portion of the building will be a coloured concrete panel formliner to reflect ecology and history of the area
 - Consultation summary will be posted on Engage Victoria prior to above ground construction of the NSF.








SRLA Update | Kingston Road U-turn

- Environmental Performance Requirement (EPR) T3.4 requires SRLA to provide: *a permanent* local alternative to accommodate the right turn demand from Old Dandenong Road north approach into Kingston Road prior to the closure of Old Dandenong Road and the use of access gates on Kingston Road.
- Four options were assessed
- Department of Transport and Planning were consulted on the preferred option and approved relevant traffic approvals
- Laing O'Rourke developed the detailed design and are building the U-turn. Works expected to be completed by end of August 2024.




Kingston Road U-turn construction


U-Turn is complete. Works in September to install road lighting.


Initial and Early Works | Current works

Eastern tunnel entrance

- D-Wall construction started in early- April
- D-walls are progressing well
- Extended hours from 6-10pm weeknights and 1-5pm Saturdays for concreting works until December 2024.



- 100% piles have been completed
- Urban Design Landscape Plan approved
- Backfill to be completed shortly
- Foundations to be built from September
- Extended hours from 6-10pm weeknights and 1-5pm Saturdays for concreting works through to end of December; 20 instances only.










Initial and Early Works | Dingley Bypass tree reuse

Trees removed along the Dingley Bypass are being reused at Melbourne Zoo.

- First batch delivered in late-July
- Second batch delivered 7 August
- Trees not required by the zoo are turned to mulch and offered to local stakeholders including Kingston City Council, Heatherton Dingley Uniting Church, Moorabbin Airport, Christway College, Parks
 Victoria and Kingston Heath Golf Club.









Initial and Early Works | Old Dandenong Road permanent closure

From 1 October 2024

Approximate additional travel time is 1-3 minutes in off-peak and peak travel

Additional travel time has been modelled and driven in live traffic conditions










Alternative routes

Initial and Early Works | Noise Monitoring

- There are four noise monitors currently active within our work sites
- Noise monitoring is undertaken 24 hours a day

Between May and August 2024:

- Zero instances of noise levels exceeding the noise limit during this period
- No additional controls were required on or offsite to manage noise above expected levels.

Clarinda Recycling Facility reconfiguration | Consultation

Top three areas community want considered:

- Air quality
- Noise
- Construction impacts.

These potential impacts will be addressed through the draft Stage 2 Site Management Environmental Improvement Plan.

SRL East Works | Environmental Impact Assessment

- The environmental impact assessment of SRL East works in the Clarinda Materials Recycling Facility (Alex Fraser Group) site concluded there are no significant new effects on the environment
- This means no further assessments are required and works can proceed
- Impacts from the works including construction of two tunnel access shafts and tunnelling support facilities will be managed via the SRL East Environmental Management Framework and the Environmental Performance Requirements
- We have consulted with the Minister, Kingston City Council, EPA, Melbourne Water, Southern Rural Water, Registered Aboriginal Parties and Department of Transport and Planning.





SRL East works | Impacts and Management

Environmental modelling

- SRLA completed detailed traffic, noise, vibration, air quality, surface water (incl. flooding), groundwater and electromagnetic impact modelling as part of the EES
- Suburban Connect have completed detailed groundwater, air quality, noise, vibration, surface water and traffic modelling for the Clarinda Recycling Facility and Stabling Facility. The models will be continually updated as works progress.

Environmental mitigations and controls required for Clarinda and Heatherton

- Acoustic sheds
- 3 metre hoarding around public-facing boundaries
- Covering spoil held on site
- Water Treatment Plants to treat certain types of water prior to release into stormwater
- Staging works to minimise out of hours impacts

- Noise/Vibration monitoring. Suburban Connect will be alerted should any noise, vibration or air quality exceedances occur and will respond with additional controls as required
- Reducing dust via ground compaction and spraying surfaces with water and natural polymers





Clarinda site establishment





High voltage substation | West of Clarinda Recycling Facility

Proposed from October 2024

- Peace Road intermittent closure for maintenance and to widen entrance to Kingston Road
- Earthworks

Proposed from November 2024

- Concrete pavement
- Landscaping
- Handover to United Energy to complete the works.







Clarinda Recycling Facility | Site establishment

Stage 1: proposed late 2024 – early 2025

- Tree and vegetation removal, fencing, modifying shared access and internal roads, service connections and dewatering ponds
- Hardstand
- Staff facilities
- Earthworks: Pond backfill, site cut and fill

Stage 2: proposed late 2024 – early 2025

- Installing drainage
- Piling pad construction
- Bentonite foundation
- Test piles


SRL tunnel access structures | Site comparison

Heatherton and Clarinda | Traffic movements

Western Tunnel Entrance

- 300* p/day during peak construction period (September 2025)
- 49* semi-trailers p/day for precast tunnel segments (August 2027)

Clarinda Recycling Facility

- 300* p/day during peak construction (November 2026)
- 60* semi-trailers p/day for precast tunnel segments (November 2026)
