

# CRAIGIEBURN ROAD UPGRADE

**SUMMER 2024** 

Since early December, drivers have been enjoying improved traffic flow and travel times on Craigieburn Road, following the successful completion of major works on the Craigieburn Road Upgrade.

As part of the upgrade we've added 20km of new lanes, upgraded and built 16 traffic light intersections and pedestrian crossings, relocated almost 100km of essential services, and laid more than 97,000 tonnes of asphalt.

It's not just drivers benefitting from the upgrade though. There's over 14km of new and improved walking and cycling paths, providing safer crossing points and connection from Hume Highway to Mickleham Road. Plus, new priority bus lanes mean locals in Craigieburn have improved active and public transport options.

#### Finishing work

While major works are complete, we're still doing some minor finishing works, including landscaping. To safely complete these works, we'll have some temporary lane closures and speed restrictions in place at times.

Please observe on-road signage and drive safely. When our works are complete, all lanes will be opened with their designated final speed limits, ranging between 60 km/h and 80 km/h.







Our projects are about more than just roads, they're also about leaving a lasting legacy for the surrounding community to enjoy.

As part of the Craigieburn Road Upgrade, we've delivered a range of initiatives to support everything from local businesses to school programs and Indigenous culture.



As part of the team's commitment to leaving a legacy along Craigieburn Road, the project worked closely with local artists and the community to reimagine and reinvent public spaces through a legacy art trail.

With several key intersections being upgraded, the project team identified 15 locations and 30 traffic signal boxes that could be beautified with local artwork to form a uniquely local art trail. The map above shows the location of each of the signal boxes.

We put a call out for submissions from local artists and received an incredible response, with key themes being connection, culture and environment.

An assessment panel reviewed all submissions and artwork, selecting 7 artists who then curated pieces that reflect the uniqueness of Craigieburn, while also paying tribute to the local flora and fauna.

In mid-December, the Craigieburn Road Legacy Art Trail was officially unveiled by Minister Ros Spence, State Member for Kalkallo at a celebration with the artists and representatives from Major Road Projects Victoria, Department of Transport and Planning, Hume City Council and construction partner Fulton Hogan.
