Warralily Boulevard Park Armstrong Creek Consultation Summary





Planning is underway for

BARWON HEADS ROAD UPGRADE — STAGE 2

As part of this upgrade, we'll:

- add new lanes on Barwon Heads Road between Reserve Road in Charlemont and Lake Road in Armstrong Creek
- upgrade intersections at Warralily Boulevard, Central Boulevard and Precinct Road
- install new traffic lights at Newport Drive and Boundary Road
- install new pedestrian crossings with traffic lights
- build new shared walking and cycling paths and dedicated on road cycling lanes

 install new street lighting, road signage, drainage and landscaping.

Consultation

As part of this project, we'll be making some changes to Warralily Boulevard Park in Armstrong Creek.

From 14 October to 10 November 2024, we asked for your feedback to help finalise the design of this existing public open space.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the survey or provide feedback at our community pop-up sessions.

Your feedback will help shape the final designs for Warralily Boulevard Park in the Barwon Heads Road Upgrade – Stage 2 project.

Key themes

A total of 308 survey submissions were received from the community regarding draft concept designs for Warralily Boulevard Park.

The key themes were:



Toilets and other facilities

About 30% of responses highlighted the need for toilet facilities at the park, especially for families with young children. There was also support for additional seating in the park.



Playground improvements

Around 20% of respondents supported the existing playground equipment or any changes that would continue to cater for younger children. There were also suggestions to make the park more engaging for all age groups and to incorporate more nature-based play features.



Safety and accessibility

About 15% of the feedback related to improved safety, including fencing around the playground area. Other suggestions included better pedestrian access in the area.

What we heard

The feedback highlighted some common themes expressed by respondents.

"

It would be fantastic if there was a fence and gate for the playground to separate it from the road. Apart from that, we love the park that's there and can only hope the new facilities are equivalent or better than the current ones."

[I'm] pleased to see toilet facilities being initiated. This would encourage more outdoor entertainment and barbecue facilities being used."

"

I like the dog water bowl and [I'm] happy toilets [are] being installed."

"

Would be great if there was a toilet. My kid loves to play at the park, we go looking for ducks and pelicans. I pass by the park as part of my run loop around the wetlands."

Next steps

We'll use your feedback to assist in developing final designs for Warralily Boulevard Park as part of the Barwon Heads Road Upgrade – Stage 2 project.


We'll continue to provide the community with updates and information as planning progresses.
