- May June 2023 Community engagement completed.

Initial and Early Works Update

- LOR noted that since the sewer relocation, no works in Clayton except site investigations.
- From early 2024 site establishment to begin.
- From early-mid 2024 to 2025 Utility relocations including power, gas, telecommunications, water, sewer, area between Carinish Road, Haughton Road and Link Road, team are working through the methodology
- Upcoming traffic changes in Clayton in early 2024:
 - Day and night-time lane and road closures, lane closures may be needed on Carinish and Clayton roads as move into demolition
 - Footpath closures with localised pedestrian detours in place
 - Temporary car parking closures and changes to public transport services
 - Briefings will be provided to key stakeholders and local businesses ahead of works and associated disruptions.
 - o All dates are subject to change
 - CTA asked if the utility works will be hoarded off and if the play equipment be moved
 - LOR noted the worksite will set up around the play area, and while the shared path may be impacted at times, the open space won't be impacted with these works
 - LOR noted parking near the open space will be impacted for prolonged periods
 - LOR noted it will brief CTA and traders when work plan is finalised expect February onwards for the utility relocation impacts
 - LOR noted they will take as few car spaces as possible during these works.
