MPROVING CONNECTIONS

SUNBURY ROAD UPGRADE

SPRING 2023

We're upgrading Sunbury Road between Powlett Street and Bulla-Diggers Rest/Loemans Road to improve connections and make your journey safer and more reliable. Since our last update we've made significant progress on upgrading Sunbury Road.

Our team is now actively working along the entire length of the Sunbury bound lanes and traffic is travelling on the rehabilitated Sunbury bound lanes between Bulla-Diggers Rest/Loemans Road and Redstone Hill Road.

Over the next few months, we'll look to progressively open more lanes towards Sunbury as we complete works around the median strip. The new bridge is also on track to be completed in November.



Upcoming works

As we approach Spring, we'll be:

- applying the final layer of asphalt, the wearing course, to completed lanes
- continuing earthworks, installing drainage, and starting construction of the new city bound lanes from Aitken Street to Powlett Street.
- undertaking works to join the new bridge over Jacksons Creek to the new lanes and shared walking and cycling path along Sunbury Road, including installing pedestrian railings and placing the asphalt layers.

Changes to how you travel

Bulla-Diggers Rest/Loemans Road and Redstone Hill Road


As we continue with the rehabilitation of the Sunbury bound lanes, we'll be opening lanes in stages.

To ensure safety during the construction of the new centre median, sections of the centre lanes along Sunbury Road will need to be temporarily closed. However, one lane in each direction will remain open as the works progress.

There may be changes to how you travel including:

- traffic reduced to one lane under traffic management
- lane closures as required
- speed reductions.

Please follow the directions of electronic signs and traffic controllers in the area for both your safety and our workers.


Major work on the Sunbury Line Upgrade is now complete

Upgrades over the last four years mean the Sunbury Line is now ready to run bigger, more modern trains when the Metro Tunnel opens in 2025.

These works, delivered by Rail Projects Victoria, included:

- power and signalling upgrades
- 5 new and 10 upgraded substations along the line
- platform extensions at 8 stations
- new wheelchair boarding pads
- upgrades to train stabling at Sunbury, Calder Park and Watergardens
- removing the Gap Road level crossing, in partnership with the Level Crossing Removal Project.

Thank you to the community for your support and patience while we delivered the Sunbury Line Upgrade.



What's a wearing course?

The final layer of asphalt, known as the wearing course, is applied during the last stage of road construction. This layer gives the new surface a smooth finish, ensuring a higher quality ride.

Once the wearing course is in place, we apply the final line markings, install traffic safety barriers, and construct the center median.

We've now opened almost 2km of dual lane road with its final wearing course, a major milestone for the project! Enjoy the smoother ride!
