Works update

 LOR referred to the slide presentation and provided an update on works including:

Works staging for 2024

- Works will involve site investigations & site establishment.
- Non-commercial demolition should be completed by May to June 2024.
- Commercial demolition on corner of Clayton and Carinish Roads.

Upcoming works

- Combined services route Victrack underground services relocations from early March to late April.
- o Traffic changes in early 2024 include:
- Day time and night-time lane closures and road closures: Link Road, Haughton Road, Carinish Road, Clayton Road.
- Footpath closures with localised pedestrian detours in place.
- Temporary car parking closures and changes to public transport services: Haughton Road and Remembrance Gardens.
- Electorate Office (EO) for Hon. Steve Dimopoulos, MP asked if Clayton Road will be closed during the school holidays.
- LOR noted the staging is conditional; MP EO noted school holidays is preferred timing.
- EO for The Hon. Steve Dimopoulos, MP asked about arrangements for worker parking.
- LOR noted workers will use the compound parking across the road.
- Signage and postcard leaflets to given to patrons for parking availability.
- EO for The Hon. Steve Dimopoulos, MP asked how will marshalling of trucks be handled.
- LOR noted safety is paramount.
- ACTION: LOR to communicate staging for trucks.
- LOR noted carparks will be reinstated over Easter.
- CTA asked if roads not used for works will be reopened. LOR noted roads needed for daytime works will be open from 6pm to 7am.
- EO for The Hon. Steve Dimopoulos, MP asked about emergency services and bus services. LOR noted buses and emergency services are given priority.
- VMS signs indicating the traffic changes.
- Works notice to 4700 letterboxes with 263 business and properties doorknocked plus radio advertising.
- o CTA asked where the VMS will be located.
- o ACTION: Confirm locations of VMS.
- CTA asked if VMS signs are only active when road closures are in place, noting it doesn't want people to divert for 6 to 8 weeks.
- SRLA noted the messages may be able to be turned off easily when not needed.
- Some delays to public transport due to closures depending on the traffic.
- Briefings will be provided to key stakeholders and local businesses ahead of works and disruptions.
- CTA asked for a digital media package to share on their channels.
- ACTION: SRLA to confirm availability of digital media package and send to CTA if available.


