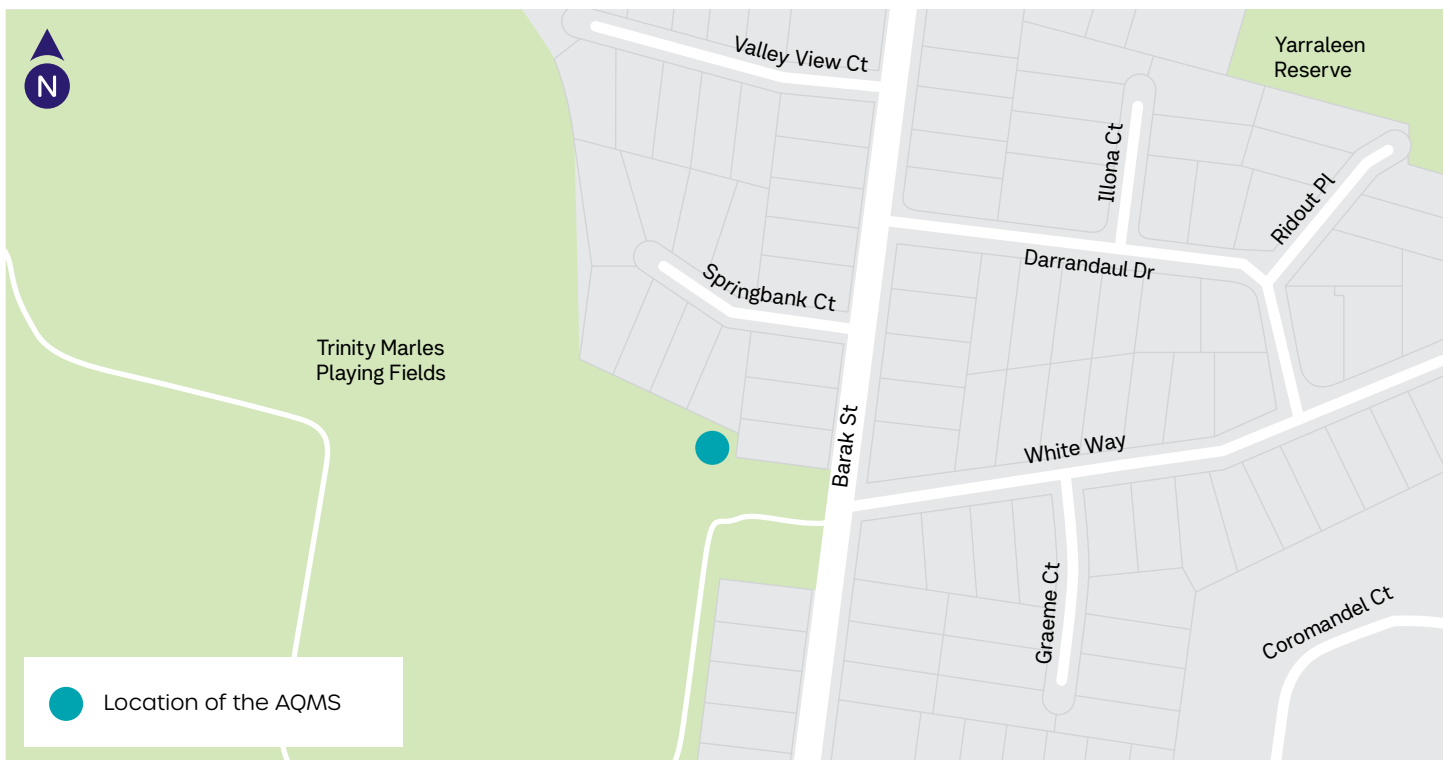
Air Quality Monitoring Station relocation at Trinity Grammar School Bulleen

Work will begin next Monday 28 June to relocate an Air Quality Monitoring Station (AQMS) at the Trinity Grammar School's Marles Playing Fields, which will be used to measure the air quality before and after construction of North East Link.

As part of the Environmental Performance Requirements for the project, monitoring of ambient air quality is required in six locations across the project area (including this location) to help us understand current local conditions. The AQMS at Trinity Grammar School will operate until July 2028.

You may notice work crews in the area drilling, pouring concrete and installing the underground electricity connection, concrete pad and fencing for the monitoring station. We expect the works will take five days to complete. Once operational, noise from the AQMS will be minimal and will be monitored regularly.


We appreciate your patience and understanding throughout these works.

FAQs

Why is the AQMS being relocated?

The existing Air Quality Monitoring Station (AQMS) is located on a portion of the site that is required for the construction of the project and therefore needs to be relocated away from construction activities. NELP has identified a suitable site for the AQMS, in consultation with Trinity Grammar School and the Environment Protection Authority (EPA), in the north-eastern corner of the school site, near Barak Street and White Way.

When will construction start and finish?

Crews will begin construction of the AQMS on Monday 28 June for a period of 5 days.

Will there be any impacts to residents during construction?

Nearby residents may notice some construction noise during the day.

Will there be any tree loss due to construction?

No trees will be impacted through the construction of the AQMS.

How long will the AQMS be operational for?

The station will carry out air quality monitoring until July 2028.

What will the AQMS measure?

The monitoring station will measure PM10 and PM2.5 and the results will be compared with relevant Australian and Victorian air quality standards.

A technician will routinely visit the monitoring station to conduct a site inspection, maintenance, and calibration checks.

Will there be any noise from the AQMS once operational?

This noise from the AQMS will be minimal and within the levels outlined in the projects' Environmental Performance Requirements (EPRs). Noise levels will be monitored regularly.
