Fyans Street

South Geelong to Waurn Ponds Duplication

October 2024

Major construction on the South Geelong to Waurn Ponds Duplication is complete. The project has removed two dangerous and congested level crossings and delivered two upgraded stations for passengers on Victoria's busiest regional rail line.

Major construction is complete on the project, with minor works to continue over coming months. During the winter construction blitz, we removed two level crossings at Fyans Street and Surf Coast Highway, duplicated more than 8 kilometres of track and delivered two upgraded stations, to Marshall and South Geelong.

What we are doing

We're completing the final phases of works on and adjacent to the new elevated rail bridge at Fyans Street.

Works will take place between 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday, with 24-hour works taking place from Saturday 5 October to Sunday 6 October.

Works will include:

- walking and cycling path finishing works
- landscaping, including hydroseeding, and tree planting
- permanent streetlight commissioning
- line-marking
- fencing and access gate installation
- minor drainage and swale finishing works.

What to be aware of

Coaches will replace trains between Geelong and Warrnambool from Saturday 5 to Sunday 6 October. Significant delays are expected. Check before you travel at bigbuild.vic.gov.au.

There will be regular vehicle movements and crews continuing work in the area. Localised traffic management will be in place for community and worker safety.

Upgrading the Geelong Line

The Victorian and Australian governments are investing more than a billion dollars in projects to deliver better stations and enable more frequent services for communities between South Geelong and Waurn Ponds.

Major construction on the South Geelong to Waurn Ponds Duplication is complete. The project has upgraded South Geelong and Marshall stations and removed the dangerous and congested level crossings at Fyans Street and Surf Coast Highway.

The project is being delivered on behalf of the Victorian and Australian governments as part of the Regional Rail Revival program.









How we're minimising impacts

Dust

We use a range of measures to minimise dust from construction activities, including the use of water carts to wet down work areas and suppress dust.

Noise and vibration

We regularly monitor noise and vibration levels to make sure they are within the Environment Protection Authority guidelines and aim to limit out-of-hours works where possible.

Lighting

Where possible, portable light towers will be positioned away from residential properties with measures in place to prevent light spill into homes and private areas.
