MICKLEHAM ROAD UPGRADE – STAGE 1

MAY 2025

Major works on the Mickleham Road Upgrade – Stage 1 are complete, with all new lanes open, providing motorists with safer and more reliable journeys.

Thank you for your continued patience while we added extra lanes in both directions between Somerton Road and Dellamore Boulevard, upgraded key intersections, replaced the roundabout with new traffic lights at Mickleham and Somerton roads,

and built new walking and cycling paths to improve access to local shops and other amenities.

Finishing works

We'll complete our finishing works by mid-year. These include landscaping, working with partners to activate street lighting, and minor road works. To safely complete these works, we'll have some temporary lane closures and speed reductions in place at times.





Lemonwood Drive and Hillview Road intersections





PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

More reliable journeys: We've added new lanes and upgraded key intersections to help you get home safer and sooner.



New and upgraded paths: We've added more than 4 kilometres of new shared walking and cycling paths, and pedestrian crossings at traffic lights.



Upgraded intersections: We've upgraded several intersections with traffic lights and new lanes, improving safety and traffic flow for all users.




TREE PLANTING

Working with local schools: We partnered with local schools to plant trees near the road and on school grounds, teaching students about sustainability and the environment.



Improved safety features: The upgraded road includes safety improvements such as road safety barriers and more street lighting.



Innovative solutions: We led the way with sustainable construction, using calcined clay in our concrete mix, reducing carbon emissions by up to 50% compared to general-purpose cement.
