



NARRE WARREN-CRANBOURNE ROAD UPGRADE

FEBRUARY 2024



We're building extra lanes and upgrading intersections on Narre Warren-Cranbourne Road to make it quicker, easier, and safer to get you where you need to be.

It's been a busy few months as we've worked to finish two key intersection upgrades.

In January, we opened:

- the Lyall Street intersection, which has been realigned to better connect with the new intersection at New Holland Drive
- the new southbound lanes and part of the new intersection of Cameron Street and South Gippsland Highway.

We've also:

- placed the final layer of asphalt and permanent linemarking at the Thompsons Road intersection
- continued building the service road and northbound lanes between Sladen Street and Camms Road, with the service road entry near Marklin Street and the exit near Loch Street due to open this month
- relocated underground utilities and power poles, and continued building the new northbound lanes at Bellarine Drive and Sunbird Avenue

- worked to finish the Rochester Parade intersection upgrade, adding extra lanes to make it faster and easier to access homes, Hunters Green retirement village and Hunt Club Village shopping centre.

Later this month, we'll open the Rochester Parade intersection and start work on the Camms Road intersection. Read on for more information.

WHAT'S COMING UP

The new Rochester Parade intersection will open in February, and we'll also start work to upgrade the intersection of Camms and Narre Warren-Cranbourne roads. We'll also start Stage 2 works to upgrade the Berwick-Cranbourne Road intersection.

In late February, we'll finish work on the southern side of the Berwick-Cranbourne Road intersection and start work to build the northern side. We're building this intersection in halves, to reduce disruption in the area. By building the new intersection this way, it means traffic can flow in both directions along Berwick-Cranbourne Road while we work.

While we build the approach to this new intersection, Gwenton Avenue and the eastern entrance and exit of Berwick-Cranbourne Road service road will stay closed until mid-April. We'd planned to finish most of this work in December and January, however the rain over summer slowed our progress, and we had to change our plans. Existing detours will remain in place.

Childers Street will also close at Narre Warren-Cranbourne Road until early June.

Further south, there will continue to be lane closures on the South Gippsland Highway until mid-2024, while we continue building the new intersection and lanes at Cameron Street.

In late February, we'll change the layout of Cameron Street by moving barriers, so we can continue building the new northbound lanes and the

entrance into the service road. Traffic will travel on the new southbound lanes.

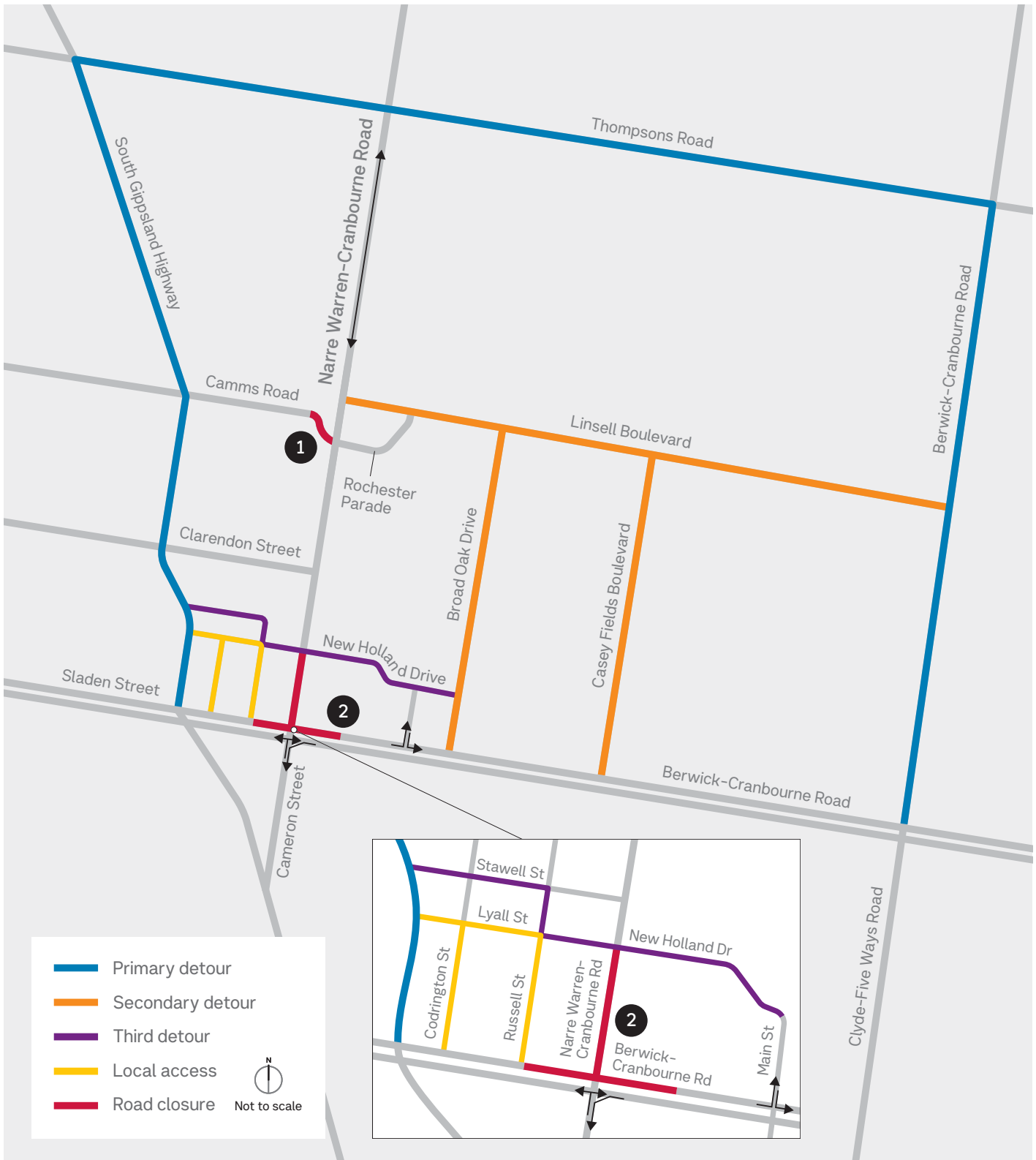
As part of this change, motorists will leave the main lanes on Cameron Street and use a temporary entrance near Elmslie Drive to enter the service road. Look out for on road signage on where to enter the service road.

1 Closure of Camms Road at Narre Warren-Cranbourne Road

Closure date	From 8pm Sunday 18 February , Camms Road will be closed at Narre Warren-Cranbourne Road until early June. Scan the QR code above to plan your journey.
Public and heavy vehicle detour	Via South Gippsland Highway, Thompsons Road and Berwick-Cranbourne Road. Delays expected of up to 25 minutes.
Local resident and business access	Via South Gippsland Highway, Thompsons and Berwick-Cranbourne roads, Linsell Boulevard, Broad Oak Drive and Casey Fields Boulevard.
Bus service changes	PTV Bus 798 will detour during the closure. Five stops on Camms Road will temporarily close. Use stops at Bowen Street/High Street or Highview Avenue/Camms Road.



2 Closure of Narre Warren-Cranbourne Road between New Holland Drive and Berwick-Cranbourne Road

Closure date From 8pm, Thursday 29 February until early June. Scan the QR code to plan your journey.

Public and heavy vehicle detour South Gippsland Highway, Thompsons Road and Berwick-Cranbourne Road. Delays expected of up to 20 minutes.

Local resident and business access Linsell Boulevard, Broad Oak Drive and Casey Fields Boulevard.

Bus service changes The 898 bus will take a small detour via Russell and Lyall streets to get to and from Narre Warren-Cranbourne Road. No stops will be impacted.
