Construction update



Domain Precinct

May 2024

Works to construct the Metro Tunnel's Anzac Station are progressing. This update provides an outline of current and upcoming works in your area in May 2024.

Works snapshot: May

In April, we built the tram connection from St Kilda Road into Domain Road and commenced work on the forecourt of the eastern entrance adjacent to the Shrine of Remembrance. The final pedestrian crossing to the Anzac Tram Stop was also opened in April.

In May 2024 works within the Domain precinct will focus on rebuilding Domain Road and on the forecourt areas for the station entrances on each side of St Kilda Road. Additionally, we'll continue reinstatement of the South African Soldiers' Memorial, with works to lay the heritage blocks having commenced in April.

Later in 2024 works will focus on completing the South African Soldiers' Memorial reinstatement, reopening Domain Road, opening the Albert Road green link parkland and returning Edmund Herring Oval to the community. We'll also continue station construction, utility connections, kerbing works, separated bike lane installation adjacent to the Albert Road Reserve entrance, as well as landscaping and planting.

Construction works within the Domain precinct during May 2024 will include:

- Reinstatement works on Domain Road and construction of a new tram and bus stop
- Edmund Herring Oval site facilities demolition
- Station entrance construction
- Asphalting, median works and construction of footpaths
- South African Soldiers' Memorial reinstatement
- Station fit out.

Domain Road construction and Edmund Herring Oval site facilities demolition

Between St Kilda Road and Domain Street



Ongoing - 2024

- Underground services installation along Domain Road will continue in May, using saw cutters, excavators, Non-Destructive Digging and hand tools
- Sections of the footpath construction will take place at night, where it impacts access to Melbourne Grammar School
- The removal of the construction site at Edmund Herring Oval also commenced in April, this involves the removal of the substation, before the concrete hardstand is demolished
- The existing site sheds within Edmund Herring Oval are being relocated onto Domain Road
- These works will involve excavators with hammers and while further away, they will generate periods of high noise during standard construction hours.

St Kilda Road median works

Southbound between Park Street and Toorak Road



Ongoing - Mid 2024

- Southbound landscaping in the central median are now largely complete
- Tree planting will take place at a later time.

Northbound between Bowen Crescent and Bowen Lane



Normal

Ongoing - Mid 2024

- In May, landscaping works through this section in preparation for tree planting
- Backfilling and temporary fencing removal immediately adjacent to the tram tracks will take place out of hours after the last tram has passed
- In early May, concrete barriers will be removed, with asphalting works taking place along this section
- These works will require an overnight closure of the southbound lane of St Kilda Road
- Once these works are complete parking will be installed along St Kilda Road between Bowen Crescent and Bowen Lane
- More information will be provided closer to the date of these works.

Path reinstatement to Shrine of Remembrance grounds

Adjacent to The Cobbers sculpture

May - June 2024

- Works will commence in May on the construction of the legacy footpath connecting the St Kilda Road footpath to the Shrine of Remembrance grounds
- This will require the closure of the existing footpath from St Kilda Road connecting to The Cobbers sculpture and the Macpherson Robertson Fountain
- Pedestrian detours will be in place while the final legacy footpath is constructed. You can continue to access The Cobbers sculpture and the Macpherson Robertson Fountain via the Shrine of Remembrance grounds

 These works will involve the use of excavators and asphalting for the new footpath before the area is landscaped.

Station entrances construction

Albert Road Reserve, west entrance

Out of hours

Ongoing - 2024

- During May works will continue on the station entrance forecourt, including concrete pours and the laying of bluestone pavers around the entrance
- Works are continuing on the reinstatement of the South African Soldiers' Memorial
- Works inside the station entrance will continue until 1am each night
- Hard landscaping works around the station entrance will continue in May, including installation of kerbs, footpaths, bike lane and retaining walls.

Shrine of Remembrance, east entrance



Ongoing - 2024

- Hard landscaping works around the station entrance will continue in May, works will include installation of kerbs, footpaths, retaining walls and garden beds
- Works inside the station entrance will continue until 1am each night.

Station box construction and fit out


Concourse and platform level of station box



Ongoing - 2025

- Major construction and finishing works have been completed on the Anzac Station platforms
- Final works are continuing on the Anzac Station concourse
- Internal fit out of the station continues 24-hours a day underground. This includes installing flooring, furniture, mechanical, electrical, plumbing fit out and painting.

Intermittent construction barrier removal and set up

St Kilda Road and Albert Road

Ongoing - 2025

- As we complete works across the project, barrier removal and line marking will take place to return these areas to the public or to set up new construction areas for finishing works
- To minimise disruption to traffic these works must take place at night when there is less traffic and will require intermittent night time closures of St Kilda Road
- These works involve small cranes to load the construction barriers onto or off trucks, traffic management, light towers, spotters with whistles for the safety of works, asphalting and line marking machines
- Notification will be provided closer to the works commencing.

Traffic and transport impacts May2024

Oversized deliveries

While most deliveries to the Anzac Station site
will occur during normal hours, some deliveries
to and from site that are classified as 'oversized'
will be required outside of normal working hours
and overnight. Whenever oversized deliveries are
expected overnight, crews will be reminded of
noise requirements on site.

Shrine of Remembrance pedestrian access

 The St Kilda Road footpath leading to The Cobbers sculpture and the Macpherson Robertson Fountain will be closed in May to build the legacy footpath. A pedestrian detour will be in place during these works.

St Kilda Road - Northbound

- There will be overnight closures of St Kilda Road northbound in May to remove barriers, asphalt and linemark
- Further detail will be provided closer to the works commencing.

Park Street

 The east / west pedestrian crossing at the Park Street and St Kilda Road intersection to the Shrine of Remembrance grounds will close at times in May to complete the final pedestrian connections and traffic setup.


