## 1 Executive Summary

EPBC Approval No. 2010/5741 under the EBPC Act (the Approval) was granted to the Roads Corporation (trading as VicRoads) on 17 April 2014 in relation to the construction of the Western Highway Project Section 2, Beaufort to Ararat, Victoria (the 'approved action' or 'Project'). The Approval was varied on 10 April 2015, 23 September 2020 and 13 January 2021.

Condition 21 of the Approval provides that:

'Within three months of June 30 each year following the commencement of **construction activities**, the person taking the action must publish an annual report of compliance on their website addressing compliance with each of the conditions of this approval, including implementation of any management plans as specified in the conditions. Documentary evidence providing proof of the date of publication and non-compliance with any of the conditions of this approval must be provided to the **Department** at the same time as the annual report of compliance is published. The annual report of compliance must document the outcomes of the management plan(s) against the performance indicators of the management plan(s).'

This compliance report addresses the requirements of condition 21 for the period from 1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025 (reporting period). Proof of publication will be provided to the Commonwealth Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (The Department) at the same time as the compliance report is published. This is the twelfth compliance report to be prepared for the approved action.



## 2 Introduction

#### 2.1 Purpose of this Document

This report provides a compliance assessment with each of the conditions of the Approval for the 2024/2025 reporting period, in accordance with the requirements of Condition 21.

#### 2.2 Project Background

The Approval applies to the 'approved action', which involves the upgrade of approximately 33km of the Western Highway between Beaufort and Ararat. The approved action is being delivered in stages, as follows:

- Section 2A (Beaufort to Buangor) (completed April 2016)
- Buangor Bypass (completed November 2016)
- Section 2B (Buangor to Ararat).

Construction activities for the approved action commenced on 5 June 2014, and Section 2A and the Buangor Bypass were both completed in 2016. Section 2B of the approved action is partially constructed and involves the upgrade of a 12.5 km section of the Western Highway between Buangor and Ararat. Key elements of Section 2B include:

- Adding two lanes in each direction, including extra turning lanes
- Building a new bridge over the railway line
- Building two bridges over Hopkins River
- Adding an interchange at Hillside Road, with entry and exit ramps.
- Building 6km of new road to the south of the existing Western Highway.

The Approval relates to the following matters of national environmental significance (MNES) which are listed threatened species and communities under the EPBC Act:

- Grassy Eucalypt Woodland of the Victorian Volcanic Plain (GEWVVP)
- Natural Temperate Grassland of the Victorian Volcanic Plain (NTGVVP)
- Spiny Rice-flower (SRF)
- Button Wrinklewort (BW)
- Dwarf Galaxias (DG)
- Golden Sun Moth (GSM).

A map of the Project Area is provided as Annex 1 of the Approval.

#### 2.3 EPBC Act Approval Holder Details

The Approval was granted to the Roads Corporation (trading as VicRoads) (ABN 61 760 960 480) on 17 April 2014.

Due to Machinery of Government changes within the Victorian State Government, the Project is now being delivered by VIDA Roads (formerly the Major Road Projects Victoria), which is a division of the Victorian Infrastructure Delivery Authority (an administrative office of the Department of Transport and Planning (ABN 69 981 208 782)).

#### 2.4 Project Status

Key activities undertaken as part of the Project during the compliance reporting period (July 2024 – June 2025) include:

- Maintenance of No Go Zones (NGZ)
- Ongoing visual environmental monitoring and surveillance



- Maintenance of erosion and sediment controls
- Implementation of the Weed Management Plan, Threatened Species Management Plan and Offset Management Plans.

Since 28 October 2020, construction works for Section 2B of the approved action have been on hold. Works for the Project will not re-commence until a new Cultural Heritage Management Plan (CHMP) is prepared and approved in accordance with the Victorian *Aboriginal Heritage Act 2006*.

On 3 May 2024, the Department commenced an audit of the Project to assess compliance with the conditions of the Approval. The audit concluded in January 2025, and the audit findings were published on the Department's website.

#### 2.4.1 EPBC Approval Variation

A request for a variation to the Approval was submitted to the Department on 20 December 2022 and is currently under consideration at the time of publishing this report.

#### 2.4.2 Amendment of Threatened Species Management Plan (TSMP)

The version of the TSMP that was implemented for the Project during the reporting period is Issue No.6 dated May 2020. The version reflects design changes required to facilitate the avoidance of several trees in the project area identified as significant by some members of the Aboriginal community. This version of the TSMP was approved by the delegate of the Commonwealth Environment Minister on 22 October 2020 and by the Secretary – DEECA on 27 November 2020.

A further version of the TSMP was prepared during the compliance reporting period of June 2020 to July 2021. The amended TSMP is Issue No. 7 and was submitted to the Department for approval on 27 November 2020 pursuant to Condition 24 of the Approval and was approved on 13 January 2021. The amended TSMP was also submitted to DEECA for approval on 7 December 2020 as part of the State approval process. DEECA's assessment of the application is presently on-hold due to Project construction being on hold (see Section 2.4 above).

MRPV advised the Department of its intention to continue to operate under and implement Issue No. 6 of the TSMP in relation to all Project activities, and that Issue No. 7 would not be published on its website, until such time as the amended TSMP is approved by DEECA (formerly DELWP). On 2 February 2021, the Department confirmed that it approved of this approach and that the amended TSMP must be published within 10 business days of approval by the State.
