

Ongoing works in Watsonia and Greensborough








Greensborough Road reinstatement

- Due to be completed in November 2021
- Gas and electricity relocations are now complete.
- Road resheeting of the northbound lanes from Lower Plenty Road and Watsonia Road remains.
- Night works recommenced on Sunday 24 October and will continue over 10 shifts.
- Day works are also required between Richards Avenue and Powley Parade.





Property dismantling works


- All residential properties have been dismantled in Macleod and Yallambie.
- Works at the former petrol station on the corner of Greensborough and Yallambie roads will continue until the end of the year.





Service relocations on 'Old' Greensborough Road


- AusNet are expecting to commission the newly installed underground electricity services on Sunday 31 October.
- This work will involve a road closure on 'Old' Greensborough Road between Santon and Doris Street and a power outage.
- Affected residents and businesses have been given early notice by AusNet and NELP/CPB.
- Phone calls, texts and email follow ups to impacted businesses and residents.
- NBN commissioning works are also expected by the end of the year.





Telecommunication relocation works

- Site investigation works will start next week on Nell Street, Longmuir Street, Frensham Road and Rasheda Street.
- Investigations will inform the planning and design phase for service relocation works expected to start early next year.

Mobile phone tower relocation in Watsonia


- Works are in planning to relocate the Watsonia mobile phone tower.
- Before the tower can be relocated, underground services need to be rediverted around the tower.
- To make up for lost car spaces taken up by the new tower, new spaces will be made available before the tower is relocated.
- Overall, construction activities in the carpark will occur over at least 6 months.





Mobile phone tower relocation in Watsonia – Stage 1

- Laydown area will impact 25 spaces in central carpark.
- No impacts to bus route.
- Traffic management required when trenching across carpark over 5 days. Trenching will occur in sections to maintain access to southern carpark. Some spaces will be unavailable near this trench.
- Possible left turning lane closure on Greensborough Road into carpark.





Mobile phone tower relocation in Watsonia – Stage 1


- Approximately 25 spaces will be unavailable at one time as underground services are relocated.
- Works will take approximately 1 to 2 months to relocate these services before Telstra can start construction on the tower.





Mobile phone tower relocation in Watsonia – Stage 2

- Approximately 54 spaces will be unavailable during the Telstra tower works.
- Remaining works involve relocating services around the new tower location and dismantling the old tower.





Upcoming gas works in Watsonia and Greensborough








Northern Gas Mains – Watsonia Road

- Works originally planned for November/December 2021
- Pushed back to March 2022 after engagement with WTA
- Will take about 1-2 months to complete

- Night works to avoid traffic and parking disruptions during the day
- Keeping Watsonia Road open during road crossing works will be challenging due to safety issues
- A road closure with detour via Grimshaw Street will be required for at least half of the works



Watsonia Road challenges

- Small work area for excavators, trucks and site vehicles to operate in.
- Clearance from live traffic less than 1.2m in certain sections of the road.
- Bell holes
- Trench depth varies between1 and 2 metres



Northern Gas Main relocations

- Works are projected to start in early 2022, beginning with the smaller section at Watsonia Road in March.
- These works will be supported by a site compound to be built at Frensham Reserve.







Frensham Reserve

- Government approval is currently being sought to construct a site compound at Frensham Reserve.
- This will include an area for pipe storage and equipment, site sheds and amenities for the crew and worker parking.
- The pedestrian and cyclist path will be detoured around the site.
- Construction vehicles will enter and exit via Elder Street and Frensham Road.
- The site compound is expected to be set up next year.



Community Engagement

- A fact sheet is being developed to introduce upcoming works in Watsonia
- Ongoing conversations with affected residents near worksites.
- Relocation and respite offers for night works, including Greensborough Road resheeting.
- New notifications have been distributed for 'Old' Greensborough Road, Nell to Rasheda Street site investigations and an update on property dismantling.
- Updated signage for Greensborough Road share user path diversion installed
