This includes advice and guidance for permits and licenses, small business development guidance and opportunities for grants and funding.

Free services offered to businesses by your local council

Bayside City Council

Business concierge

Personal business concierge who can assist you with applying for permits, building permissions, business registrations and trading permits.

Business mentoring

Free one-on-one mentoring sessions through the small business mentoring service, where you can seek advice and support from experienced mentors at any stage of your business journey.

A free service that provides a business expert to guide you through the process of registering your business and any permits and approvals you require.

A range of services to assist in reducing business costs. This includes finance programs and an energy advisor to help you with assessments, energy upgrade funding and advice on available government schemes.

Free mentoring program that provides confidential advice from business mentors.
