School Engagement Program - West Gate Kids

School Engagement Program

- West Gate Kids is the school engagement program of the West Gate Tunnel Project
- Targeting schools in Melbourne's west
- Created for primary and secondary students aged 10 to 14
- West Gate Kids links directly to the school curriculum and promotes the study of Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Maths (STEAM) subjects.
- Promotes real-world learning, using challenges from the project as a basis for its activities.



Delivery and Statistics

- Sessions are delivered by award winning scientist Dr Lorien Parker of SciencePlay Kids.
- Students are immersed in the world of science via a variety of hands-on experiments related to how cities work, involving electricity circuits, bridges, tunnels and more.
- To date 776 students have been engaged in 10 schools.
- By the end of 2019, West Gate Kids expects to have engaged over 1000 students across 15 primary and secondary schools in the western suburbs.

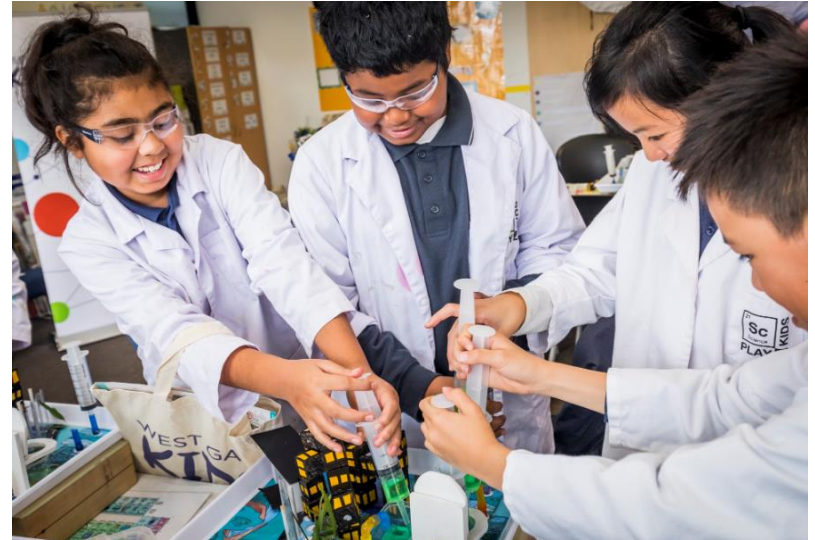


CLG Invitation

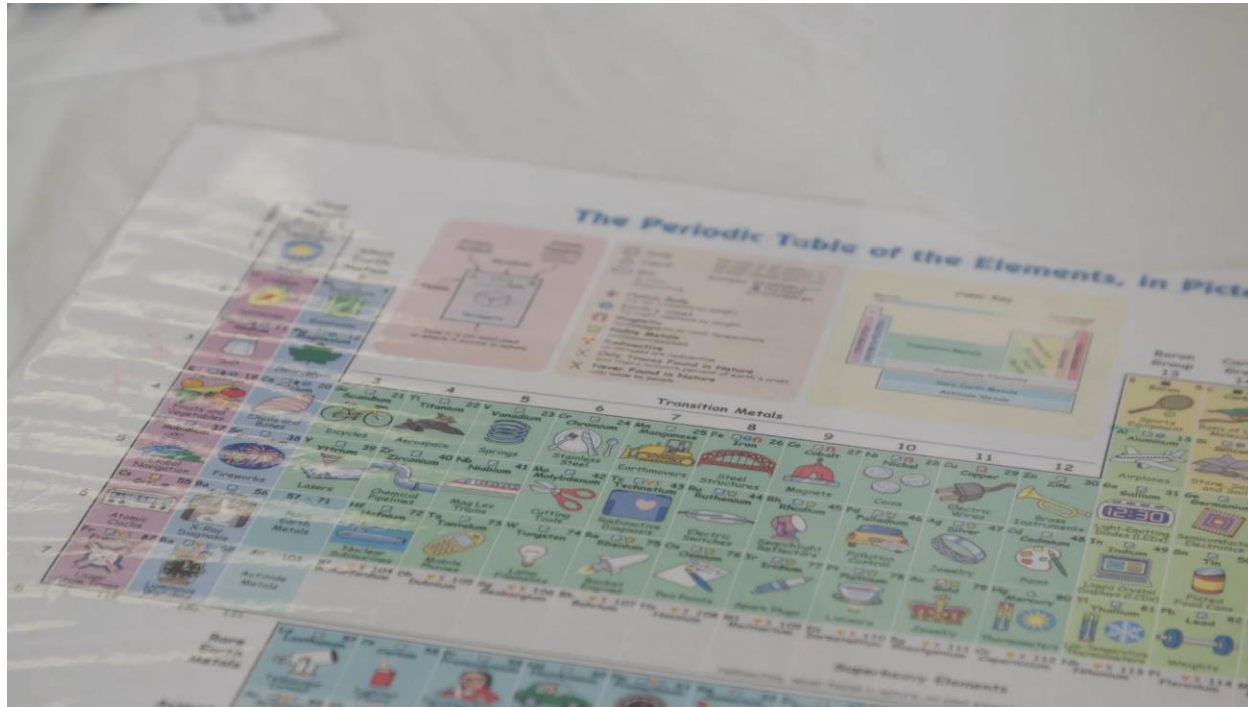
