

Monthly construction update

Domain precinct

November 2023

Works to construct the Metro Tunnel's Anzac Station are progressing. This update provides an outline of current and upcoming works in your area in November.

In October we completed major construction works along sections of St Kilda Road, including construction of separated bike lanes, kerbing and drainage. Major progress was also made in building the Anzac Station entrance roof at Albert Road, with the first of two concrete pours for the roof slab completed.

In November works will continue to build the roof at the Anzac Station Albert Road entrance and the canopy at the Anzac Station Shrine of Remembrance entrance. Works will also continue to build public spaces in the area and the remaining final footpaths, kerbs, utilities and separated bike lanes along St Kilda Road, as well as asphalting of key intersections in the area.

Underground fit out works inside the station entrances and station boxes are continuing, including the installation of lifts, escalators and switching on some of permanent power to the station

Construction snapshot

Construction works within the Domain precinct during November 2023 will include:

- Kerb and footpath works
- Station entrance construction
- Asphalting of bike lanes, roads and key intersections
- Albert Road linear park construction
- Utility connections
- Station fit out
- Train testing through tunnel.

When are we working?



Normal construction hours

7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday 7am to 1pm, Saturdays.



Out of hours

Some works are required to take place out of normal construction hours.



24 hours

24 hour works are sometimes required during peak construction activities.







Works in your area

Station entrance construction - Albert Road Reserve

Albert Road Reserve and Albert Road Ongoing - 2024



- The steel tying and concrete of the roof of the Albert Road entrance will be complete by mid-November
- Steel tying, formwork and concrete pours for the internal walls will continue in November. These works will take place until 1am each night under the roof
- Due to the nature of these works, concrete pours must be continuous and may run past 10pm
- Waterproofing of the station roof and backfilling will continue in November. Once complete, road works including excavators, vibration rollers and laying of the road surface will commence.

Albert Road construction

Albert Road, between Kings Way and St Kilda Road

Ongoing - 2024



- Eastbound lanes along Albert Road between Kings Way and 50 Albert Road will be closed from 6pm Sunday 12 November until 6am Friday 16 November to lay the final asphalt layer in this section of Albert Road and to resurface the Kings Way and Albert Road intersection road surface.
- Due to the nature of these works, progress may be impacted by weather conditions. We will let you know of any impacts to works and changes in times or dates.
 Please expect detours in place and traffic controllers and signage available to guide you around the works.
 More information will be provided closer to the date
- There will be one night of works to readjust the construction barriers on the corner of St Kilda Road and Albert Road to install a new construction gate
- In November, there will be a short daytime closure of the westbound lane while we install new street poles
- During November, construction will continue on the green link parkland from St Kilda Road to Kings Way.
 These works include construction of the hard and soft landscaping and final drainage.

Resurfacing of key intersections

Kings Way and Albert Road intersection

November 12 - 16



- As part of the Metro Tunnel Project, the intersection of Kings Way and Albert Road will be resurfaced with new asphalt and new line marking
- These works will take place each night, 6pm to 6am, Sundays to Thursdays from 6pm Sunday 12 November until 6am Friday 17 November. To minimise disruption to traffic these works must take place at night when there is less traffic
- This work includes the use of a profiler, a paver, vibration rollers, light towers and Non-Destructive Digging trucks
- Due to the nature of these works, progress may be impacted by weather conditions. We will let you know of any impacts to works and changes in times or dates

- Please expect detours in place and traffic controllers and signage available to guide you around the works
- More information will be provided closer to the date of works.

St Kilda Road and Toorak Road intersection

Late November to early December



- As part of the Metro Tunnel Project, the intersection of Kings Way and Albert Road will be resurfaced with new asphalt and new line marking
- These works will take place each night, 6pm to 6am, Sundays to Thursdays. To minimise disruption to traffic these works must take place at night when there is less traffic
- This work includes the use of a profiler, a paver, vibration rollers, light towers and Non-Destructive Digging trucks
- Due to the nature of these works, progress may be impacted by weather conditions. We will let you know of any impacts to works and changes in times or dates
- Please expect detours in place and traffic controllers and signage available to guide you around the works

St Kilda Road utility, median, kerbing and footpath works

Kerb and footpath works Bowen Lane to Bowen Crescent

Ongoing until December 2023



- Construction of the kerbs, footpath, roadway, separated bike lanes and garden beds will continue in November
- There will be pedestrian diversions around the site as the final footpath asphalting takes place. Please expect pedestrian detours in place and signage available to guide you around the works
- Access to buildings in this section of St Kilda Road will be maintained at all times.

Utility connections Park Street to Domain Road

Ongoing



- Installation of inground services, footpaths, kerbs and roadways will continue on the surface within the main construction site
- The left turn lane from St Kilda Road into Park Street will be intermittently closed in November to allow for construction works in the garden bed
- At times in November, the Park Street pedestrian crossing across St Kilda Road will be closed to complete final utility works.

Bowen Crescent

Ongoing to December 2023



 Utility works and construction of the raised pedestrian crossing over Bowen Crescent will take place in November. These works will require a short-term road closure at the intersection of Bowen Crescent and St Kilda Road. More information will be provided closer to the works.

Separated bike lane installations

St Kilda Road, between Bromby Street to Toorak Road

Ongoing until late November 2023



- Works to construct the new separated bike lanes and drainage on the southbound lanes of St Kilda Road continue. These works involve Non-Destructive Digging, excavation and installation of conduits, bike lanes and asphalting
- Once works are complete, barrier removal, final wearing course asphalt line marking will take place between the Anzac Station tram platform and Toorak Road. To minimise disruption to traffic these works must take place at night when there is less traffic and will require intermittent night time closures of St Kilda Road. This work includes the use of a profiler, a paver, vibration rollers, light towers and Non-Destructive Digging trucks

Station entrance construction - Shrine of Remembrance

Domain Road

Ongoing



- Works have commenced on the internal fit out of the station entrance
- In November, structural works on the elevator shaft and works on the canopy for the stair and escalator entrance will continue
- Works under the station roof will continue overnight.

Station box construction and fit out

Concourse and platform level of station box

Ongoing



 Internal fit out of the station continues 24-hours a day underground. This includes installing flooring, furniture,

- mechanical, electrical, plumbing fit out and painting
- Plant and HV equipment continue to be installed in back-of-house rooms
- Work is also continuing to switch on permanent power across areas of the station.

Construction barrier removal and set up

St Kilda Road and Albert Road

Ongoing until 2025



- As we complete works areas across the project sites, barrier removal and line marking will take place to return these areas to the public or to set up new construction areas for finishing works
- To minimise disruption to traffic these works must take place at night when there is less traffic and will require intermittent night time closures of St Kilda Road
- These works involve small cranes to load the construction barriers onto or off of trucks, traffic management, light towers, spotters with whistles for the safety of works, asphalting and line marking machines.

Overnight utility installation

St Kilda Road

Mid-November to early December 2023



- For three nights in mid-November we will install conduits underneath the outbound lane of St Kilda Road at the intersection of Domain Road
- These works will take three consecutive nights and involve saw cutting the road, trenching, laying of new conduits and backfilling
- These works are expected to generate high levels of noise during saw cutting
- These works must take place at night while St Kilda Road is closed.

Traffic and transport impacts

Oversized deliveries

While most deliveries to the Anzac Station site
will occur during normal hours, some deliveries
to and from site that are classified as 'oversized'
will be required outside of normal working hours
and overnight. Whenever oversized deliveries are
expected overnight, crews will be reminded of noise
requirements on site.

St Kilda Road - Southbound

- Cyclists continue to merge with vehicles between Park Street and Domain Road.
- The right turn from St Kilda Road onto Kings Way remains closed
- There will be three nights of southbound closures in mid-November to install underground conduits and to lay the final wearing course
- There will an overnight closure of St Kilda Road southbound to remove the barriers between Bromby Street and Toorak Road.

St Kilda Road - Northbound

— There will be a closure of St Kilda Road northbound

to readjust barriers.

Bowen Lane

- Bowen Lane will reopen to St Kilda Road in mid-November
- Pedestrian access to Bowen Lane from St Kilda Road will be closed at times to facilitate the kerb and footpath works.

Park Street


- The left turn lane from St Kilda Road into Park Street will be intermittently closed in November to allow for construction works in the garden bed
- At times in November, the Park Street pedestrian crossing across St Kilda Road will be closed to complete final utility works.

Kings Way and Albert Road intersection

 Some lanes of the intersection will be closed each night from Sunday to Thursday in mid-November for final asphalting.

Toorak Road and St Kilda Road intersection

 The intersection will be closed each night for six nights in late November to early December for final asphalting.


Tree planting completed for 2023

We've completed tree planting in the 2023 planting season, planting 51 trees across the precinct with tree planting to recommence during the cooler months after April 2024, giving the trees a better chance of establishing in their

While we've paused tree planting over the warmer months, landscaping around the future Anzac Station on St Kilda Road is still underway, with new green spaces connecting the city's first direct tram/train interchange to surrounding parkland.

By the end of the project, over 200 trees will be planted in the area, With the installation of turf and shrubs, Domain is looking as green as the structures holding up the Anzac Station canopy!
