

| Environment Effects Statement (EES) | SRLA provided an overview and update on the EES process and noted the following: SRL East EES public hearings completed Thursday 5 May 2022. Inquiry and Advisory Committee (IAC) will prepare their report for the Minister for Planning in the coming months. In Quarter 3 of 2022, the Minister for Planning will release his Final EES Assessment of the project. Pending a favourable assessment by the Minister for Planning, SRLA would request the Minister for Planning approve draft Planning Scheme Amendment GC197, allowing planning permission for the Project. | | | | | | |

| | FG enquired about compulsory acquisition timelines. SRLA responded that acquisition cannot occur until the formal planning permission is received (expected Quarter 3 of 2022). SRLA noted that acquisition will rely on the construction program and all properties identified for acquisition will not be required at the same time. SRLA also noted that notifications arrive six months or more before possession of the property. SD asked the total number of landowners impacted by acquisition. | | The guidelines are designed to assist residents and landowners through the acquisition process and project disruptions. Ongoing support is available to those who are directly affected. SRLA conducts 1:1 meetings and discussions with landowners early to better understand individual circumstances and inform how SRLA provides support. | | | | | | |
| Initial and Early Works | SRLA and LOR provided and overview of Initial Works (IW) in Clayton and noted the following: | | | | | | |
| | Key Initial Work activities at Clayton: Site compound established at Carinish Road in March 2022 – hoarding to be completed soon. Site investigations locate underground services like sewer and gas pipelines, and also include soil sampling. Community information session on Wednesday 18 May at Clayton Hall. Tree removals on Dunstan and Yarram Streets scheduled w/c 23 May 2022. SRLA noted that surrounding residents have been notified of tree removal. SRLA working with Monash City Council (MCC) to offset the loss of trees in the area. Clayton sewer relocation works scheduled to commence 31 May 2022. Second stage of these works to commence later in the year. LOR noted project staff have doorknocked local traders and residents to discuss likely impacts of these works. | | | | | | |

Questions:

- SD asked how SRLA and LOR ensure Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) community members are notified.
 - LOR responded that all notifications are translated in Hindi, Vietnamese, Mandarin and Cantonese to support all community members understand the works and likely impacts.
- SD asked what is SRLA's commitment for replacing trees removed during construction.
 - SRLA responded that the project is tracking all trees removed and impacts.
 - SRLA noted that the project will double the tree canopy in and around the SRL station precincts.
 - SD encouraged the project to ensure this language is used when communicating vegetation removal with the community in order to accurately explain the impacts and measures it is taking to replace trees.
- FG asked what the use of the site compound at Clayton is.
 - LOR responded that the site compound provides office space for approximately 40 team members.
- FG asked LOR to confirm if the site will be used for laydown.
 - Action: LOR to notify PRG is site compound will be used to store materials.

LOR provided a detailed overview of the Clayton sewer relocation works and noted the following:

- Likely impacts to pedestrians and vehicles and local traders.
- Micro-tunnelling methodology involving digging access tunnels using a machine, then installing the new pipe via the access tunnel.
- Weekly Initial and Early Works meetings with MCC, LOR and SRLA.

Questions:

- FG asked LOR to ensure written materials are provided to traders during door knocking activities.
 - LOR confirmed and noted that project staff will continue to door knock traders in the coming weeks.
 - Action: SRLA to provide written communications when door-knocking local traders about upcoming works
- SD asked for an update on community sentiment.
 - Action: SRLA/LOR to provide PRG with updates at future meetings on resident and trader sentiment towards the project

SRLA provided an overview of support for traders and residents, noting the following:

- SRLA and LOR's main goal is to ensure disruptions are managed by communicating openly and frequently with community.
- SRLA and LOR are seeking proactive engagement opportunities to brief community on works.
- Trader support is a key focus for SRLA.
 - SRLA and LOR asked FG about future opportunities to brief Clayton Traders Association (CTA)
 - Action: SRLA/LOR to coordinate a briefing with the Clayton Traders Association
 - Action: SRLA/LOR/Clayton Traders Association following briefing, to discuss whether regular attendance at the Clayton Traders Association meetings would be appropriate.

Questions/comments:

 John Saunders (JS) provided feedback on hoarding installation works, noting they caused traffic congestion.
