Independent Chair of the Inner West Air Quality Community Reference Group - Patsy Toop



The Inner West AQ CRG was announced on 26 July 2018 by the Minister for Energy, Environment and Climate Change and the Minister for Roads and Road Safety



Purpose: to investigate air quality issues in the inner west of Melbourne and make recommendation to government on priority actions to improve air quality

The scope of the Inner West AQ CRG covers the areas of Maribyrnong, Hobsons Bay, and Brimbank

> Community member representatives were recruited by a public Expression of Interest process





An introductory meeting was held on 10 December 2018



Members identified key areas of interest in relation to air quality and finalised the Terms of Reference for the CRG



The next meeting is scheduled for 25 February 2019 and will focus on developing a shared baseline understanding of air quality







The initial term of the CRG is 12 months (ends in December 2019)



Meetings will occur approximately every four weeks




What's happened so far?




Community impacts:

- Noise and vibration from piling








Footscray Road






Williamstown Road interchange

- Community impacts:
 - Temporary closure of Muir Street pedestrian bridge
 - Ongoing closures of Fogarty Ave with traffic detours in place








Millers Road interchange





Beevers Street / Paringa Road

- Beevers Street full road closure for three days – property access impacts
- Staged closures of Paringa Road property access impacts
- Community impacts are largely localised changed traffic conditions as well as some increased noise and vibration






West Gate Freeway – Chambers Road to Grieve Parade

Community impacts:

- Temporary noise wall installation and demolition of existing noise wall
- Traffic detours and increased construction traffic in area
