## What are Community Reference Groups for?



CRG's are common across Melbourne. E.g. Metro Tunnel Project, Level Crossing Removal Project and West Gate Tunnel Project





## How do CRG's work?

- Community Reference Groups (CRGs) are established as advisory groups to provide local input and feedback during the planning, development and delivery of major projects such as Suburban Rail Loop East.
- As SRL progresses to delivery, the CRG will provide a forum for SRLA and contractors to directly engage with stakeholders and the Heatherton community.
- The CRG is independently chaired, and consists of a broad range of members to ensure a diverse range of views and interests from the community are represented.
- Meetings are held quarterly, with agendas circulated prior to each meeting. Presentations and minutes will be circulated after each session, these can be shared outside of CRG's.
- At times there will be confidential or commercially sensitive information discussed it will be clearly marked as such and must not be disseminated.












## **Big picture timeline**














## **SRL East Environment Effects Statement (EES)**

- **SRL East:** Victoria's first ever fully digital EES more accessible, detailed and interactive.
- 33,000 pages; 36 technical reports across 19 topics
- Prepared over two years
  - 580+ geotechnical investigations
  - Hundreds of expert studies and 10,000+ lab tests
- Public hearings held from February to May 2022
  - o 360 submissions
  - 47 witnesses and experts
  - o **39** days
  - An Urban Design Strategy will also be developed for the project, with community consultation to take place on designs




# Upcoming initial and early works





## Initial and Early Works overview

- Initial and Early Works to take place at seven project areas along the SRL East alignment.
- Works commenced in 2022 in Clayton, with additional sites to become operational from 2023.
- Key scope includes site investigations to gather additional details on the ground conditions and relocation of underground utilities. This will pave the way for major construction.
- In Heatherton works will involve:
  - Relocation of utilities
  - Site establishment
  - Construction of an access shaft for future tunnel boring machines (TBMs)

## Heatherton initial and early works – six month lookahead

#### March - May 2023

- Site investigations service location, monitoring
- Fencing installation.

### May – August 2023 - TBC

• Site establishment - site compound and earthworks between Old Dandenong Road, Dingley Bypass and Kingston Road (eastern end of stabling facility site).

### From mid-2023

- Utility relocations in and around site compound
- Electrical substation construction
- Piling for eastern portal.






## **Upcoming works**

#### Site preparation works

- From mid-March fencing and monitoring equipment will be installed around the site at 217 Kingston Road.
- Works will include site establishment activity, small machinery and work vehicles in the area.
- No changes to traffic or public transport services in Heatherton are anticipated during these works.







## **Upcoming works**

#### Site investigations

Site investigations will continue from late April.

There will be some changes to traffic and public transport including:

- Lane closures and road closures at varying times along Old Dandenong Road and Kingston Road (day and night)
- Bus stops closed along Old Dandenong Road
- Detours will be in place in the area.
